THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Quarantine Regulations recently issued at the port of Savannah:—

Special Notice to Pilots and Masters of Vessels.

*Office of Health Officer,
Savannah, October 1, 1870.*

—From and after the 1st of October until the 1st of November, the following quarantine regulations will be enforced:—

1. All vessels arriving at this port from or having touched at Key West, Florida, the West India or Bahama Islands, South America or Mexico.

2. All vessels from foreign ports without clean bills of health, or from ports where contagious or epidemic disease is known or supposed to exist; also, all vessels arriving from ports in North America, south of Savannah, with sickness on board, will anchor in Tybee Roads, opposite the Lighthouse, until visited and inspected by the health officer.

No sick seaman or passenger shall be brought to the city from any vessel in the harbours without the consent of the health officer. Pilots and masters of vessels will be held rigidly responsible for any violation of the above regulations.
