Burry Port and Gwendreath Valley Railway.
(Extension of Time for Execution of Works—
Amendment or Repeal of Acts and other
purposes.)

(Purchase of Lands and Construction of Wet Dock and Railway Approaches at Whitehaven Harbour.—Power to levy Tolls, Rates, and Duties, and to alter existing Tolls, Rates, and Duties levied at Whitehaven Harbour.—Borrowing Powers.—Working Arrangements with the London and North-Western and the Furness Railway Companies.—Repeal, Incorporation, and Amendment of Acts; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act to authorize the works and purposes following, or some of them; that is to say:—

To make and maintain a wet dock, to be constructed partly in the present North Harbour of Whitehaven, partly in the shipbuilding yard in the occupation of the Whitehaven Shipbuilding Company Limited, and partly on lands situated between the present North Harbour and Tangier-street, and on other lands adjacent thereto, with an entrance into the North Harbour; with all requisite piers, sluices, entrances, channels, cuts, culverts, embankments, wharfs, quays, landings, staiths, drops, tramways, railways, jetties, cranes, sheds, offices, houses, warehouses, buildings, and machinery for loading and unloading ships and vessels and storing merchandize, or otherwise; roads and approaches, works and conveniences.

The intended dock will be bounded on the south-west by the Bulwark and by Duke-street; on the south-east by Tangier-street and Bransty-row; on the north-east by an imaginary line drawn from the southmost end of the Bransty Hotel or Railway Booking Office to a point on the high-water mark of Whitehaven Beach, 80 yards or thereabouts to the north-east of the existing Old North Wall, and on the north-west by an imaginary line drawn from the last-mentioned point to a point in the Bulwark, 100 yards or thereabouts from its seaward extremity.

To place and maintain in Whitehaven Harbour mooring buoys, capstans, and other necessary erections and machinery, works, and conveniences, in such positions as may be expedient for warping and guiding, directing, or otherwise assisting ships and vessels approaching or quitting the said intended dock, and for other purposes in connection with the said dock.

To make and maintain the following railways, with all necessary stations, communications, roads, approaches and conveniences connected therewith:—

Railway No. 1.—A railway situated in the townships of Whitehaven and Preston Quarter, in the parish of St. Bees, and county of Cumberland, commencing at a point on the West Strand at or near the first or most southerly coal-hurry in the township of Whitehaven aforesaid, and terminating in the said township of Preston Quarter by a junction with the Whitehaven Junction Railway of the London and North-Western Railway Company, at a point on their Harbour Branch at or near to the south-eastern corner of the shipbuilding yard in the occupation of the Whitehaven Shipbuilding Company (Limited), crossing on the level the tramway at present used or occupied by the Furness Railway Company in connection with their Whitehaven and Furness Railway on the West Strand aforesaid at or near to the Old Tongue there.

Railway No. 2.—A railway situated wholly in the township of Whitehaven, in the parish of St. Bees, in the county of Cumberland, commencing by a junction with Railway No. 1 at a point on the West Strand, opposite to the Old Tongue, and terminating by a junction with the said tramway of the Furness Railway Company at a point on the West Strand opposite to Hamilton-lane.

To extend and enlarge the limits of the harbour of Whitehaven, so as to include the sites and area of the said intended wet dock and railways respectively, and all the piers, quays, wharfs, railways, and approaches made in connection therewith.

To enable the Trustees of the Port, Harbour, and Town of Whitehaven (hereinafter called the Trustees) to make and maintain the said wet dock, railways and works.

To enable the Trustees, for the purposes of the intended Act, to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, all lands, houses, or hereditaments required for such purposes, or any rights or easements over the same, and to vary or extinguish any rights or privileges connected therewith.

Southport Improvement Bill.

(Repeal, Consolidation, and Amendment of Acts; Extension of Borough boundary; Purchase of Lands and Properties, compulsorily or otherwise; Power to make Sewerage Works, new Streets, to widen Streets, and to extend the Promenade at Southport; To erect and maintain Gasworks and Sidings in connection therewith; To supply Gas in extended limits, and extend the Cemetery; Providing, improving, maintaining, and regulating Town Hall, Gaols, Police, and Fire Stations, Markets, and Fairs; To maintain and improve Parks, Museums, Libraries, and Slaughter-houses; Powers as to sewage, drainage, cleansing, lighting, watching, paving, and improving, and regulating the Borough and the Streets thereof; Prevention of nuisances; Power to lay down gas mains; New and altered tolls, rates, and duties; Powers to borrow money, make bye-laws, and impose penalties, and for other purposes.)

THE Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Southport, in the county of Lancaster (who are hereinafter called the Corporation), intend to apply to Parliament in the next Session thereof, for a Bill for the following or some of the following, among other purposes, that is to say:—

To vary, amend, and enlarge, or to repeal wholly or partially, and to consolidate and re-enact the Acts 9 and 10 Victoria, chapter 30, and "The Southport Improvement Act, 1865," and to incorporate with the said Bill, in extenso, or by reference, all or some of the powers and provisions of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869," "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," "The Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847," "The Town Police Clauses Act, 1847," "The Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847," "The Cemeteries Clauses Act, 1847," "The Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847," "The Public Health Act, 1848," "The Local Government Act, 1858," and "The Local Government Amendment Act, 1861," and also such parts of "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," relating to the recovery of damages and penalties, and to other matters, as may be deemed expedient, and to extend the operation of the said Bill to the whole of the borough, and to confirm the letters patent granted to the Corporation by Her present Majesty, bearing date the 28th day of February, in the 30th year of Her reign.

To extend the boundary of the borough, from a point in Fine Jane's Brook, 103 yards east of the bridge at Scarisbrick New-road, and thence along the centre of the Moss Ditch on the east side of Old Moss-lane to Main Heys-lane, in a south-easterly direction, and thence along the centre of the ditch on the south side of Main Heyes-lane, for a distance of 28 yards in an easterly direction to the centre of the New Moss Ditch, then in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the New Moss Ditch to the centre of the boundary brook which divides the township of Scarisbrick from the township and parish of North Meols, then along the centre of the boundary brook in a north-easterly direction to a distance of 350 yards north of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence in an easterly direction to the junction of the boundary brook with the Pool, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the Pool to Crowlands-lane, thence in a westerly direction on the north side of Crowlands-lane to its junction with the south end of Park-lane, thence in a westerly direction along the north side of the watercourse separating the lands in the occupation of Henry Blundell and William Rimmer to a point where such ditch crosses Long-lane, where the proposed boundary joins the existing boundary of the borough.

To enable the Corporation to purchase by compulsion or agreement, and to extinguish all rights and privileges in the lands next hereinafter mentioned, for and to use and employ such lands for sewerage works and sewage utilisation purposes, for settling and subsidence tanks, and for dealing with, collecting, deodorising, and disinfecting the whole or any part of the sewage or sewage matter now, or at any time hereafter, flowing through or into, or being in or upon any of the watercourses, sewers, drains, or channels vested in or under the control of the Corporation within or without the borough of Southport (hereinafter called "The Borough.")

The following are the lands to which the above powers relate:—

1stly. A piece of land belonging to Thomas Part and William Hawkshead Talbot, Esquires, trustees under the will of the late Charles Scarisbrick, Esquire, hereinafter called the Trustees, situate on the north-west of Fine Jane's Brook, bounded south-east by such brook, on the north-east and north-west by other lands of the trustees, and on the south-west by the continuation of Duke-street on other land of such trustees, and containing by admeasurement 3 acres 2 roods 10 perches.

2ndly. A piece of land also belonging to the trustees, bounded on the south and west by other land of the trustees, on the north by Butts-lane, and on the east by Fine Jane's Brook, and a cross ditch running into it, containing by admeasurement 2 acres 2 roods 34 perches, which pieces of land are situate in the township and parish of North Meols, in the county of Lancaster.

To enable the Corporation to construct and maintain from time to time, to alter, extend, and improve, cleanse, and repair, for sewerage purposes, the following works, or some or one of them.

1stly. A subsidence tank or subsidence tanks, to be situate on such first-mentioned piece of land, 80 feet or thereabouts in length, and 40 feet or thereabouts in breadth, with all such wharves, approaches, outlets, sluices, conduits, and other works and conveniences as may be required for purifying the sewage matter received into such tank or tanks, together with a sewer or drain commencing at the termination of the existing sewer in Duke-street, at a point 76 yards north-

west of the present boundary of the borough at Fine Janes Brook, and terminating in such tank or tanks.

2ndly. A subsidence tank or subsidence tanks to be situate in such secondly described piece of land, 60 feet or thereabouts in length, and 30 feet or thereabouts in breadth, with all such wharves approaches, outlets, sluices, conduits, and other works and conveniences as may be required for purifying the sewage matter received into such tank or tanks, together with a sewer or drain commencing at the termination of the sewer in Blowick-road, at a point 250 yards east of the present boundary of the borough, and terminating in such tank or tanks.

3rdly. A main sewer commencing at the junction of Park-road with Albert-road within the borough, and proceeding along Park-road in a north-westerly direction to the shore, so as to join the existing main sewers from Neville-street and Leicester-street at their termination on the foreshore, and thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 870 yards under the foreshore of the sea, into the south channel at or near low water mark, at a point 800 yards north of the head of the existing pier at Southport, all which works and the lands to be taken for the purposes of them, are situate in the township and parish of North Meols, in the county of Lancaster, or in the foreshores or bed of the sea adjacent thereto.

To enable the Corporation to make and maintain the new streets, portions of new streets, and approaches following, with all necessary works and conveniences, except where otherwise mentioned, all which streets are situate within the borough, and in the township and county aforesaid, that is to say—

To continue Part-street from its junction with Portland-street to Eastbank-street, and to extend the south-westerly extremity of Part-street, from the point where it touches the boundary of the borough to Aughton-road, in the township of Birkdale.

To continue Belmont-street in a north-westerly direction to Lord-street West, commencing at the present termination of Belmont-street, and terminating in Lord-street West aforesaid.

To make and maintain a footpath from Lord-street to West-street, commencing at the west end of the Scarisbrick Hotel in Lord-street, and crossing West-street, so as to pass along the south-west side of Brunswick-terrace and the north-east side of Osborne House, and terminating in the existing promenade at Southport.

To enable the Corporation to widen and improve the following streets, all which are situate within the borough, and in the township, parish, and county aforesaid, viz.—

1. Coronation-walk, on the west side thereof, commencing at its junction with Lord-street, crossing King-street and terminating at the boundary wall of Lower Seabank Cottage; and on the east side, commencing at the junction with Lord-street, crossing West-street, and terminating at the entrance gates of the Royal Hotel, in Coronation-walk.

2. Chapel-street, commencing at its junction with Eastbank-street, and crossing Tulketh-street, and terminating at its junction with London-street.

3. Peter-street, commencing at its junction with Leicester-street, and terminating at its junction with Saunders-street.

4. Albert-road, widening the footpath for 41 yards, commencing and terminating where it adjoins the premises belonging to William Roberts, Esquire.

5. Seabank-road, commencing at its junction with Lord-street, and terminating at its junction with Stanley-street.

6. Lord-street on the north-west side, commencing at the Mansion House, and terminating at its junction with Bold-street; on the south-east side, commencing at its junction with Duke-street, and terminating at its junction with Union-street.

7. The north side of Nevill-street, commencing at its junction with Lord-street, and terminating at its junction with Bath-street.

8. The north-east end of Zetland-street, commencing at a point 42 yards south of Manchester-road, and terminating in Manchester road.

To declare the following streets and roads to be public highways, and make special provision for removing obstructions therefrom, viz.: Nevill-street; Nevill-street South, commencing at its junction with West-street, and terminating in the existing promenade at Southport; Eastbank-street, from Lord-street to Chapel-street; and London-street, from Lord-street to Hoghton-street and Chapel-street.

To enable the Corporation to extend the existing promenade at Southport, and for that purpose to purchase, by compulsion or agreement, and enter upon and take the lands and foreshores described in the plans and sections to be deposited for the purposes of the Bill, to erect thereon the works following, with all walls, bridges, groynes, jetties, piers, buttresses, approaches, and other works and conveniences required for such extension of the promenade.

The works above referred to are the following, viz.:—

1. A new promenade and drive, 50 feet in width, commencing at Coronation-walk, at its junction with the existing promenade, and extending thence in a south-westerly direction across the boundary of the borough into the township of Birkdale, and terminating on the sea shore in such last-mentioned township at the north-west end of Weld-road.

2. A similar new promenade and drive, 60 feet in width, commencing at the end of the existing promenade in Seabank-road, and extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 1050 yards, and thence in a curve to the east and south, and terminating in Albert-road at the extremity of Hesketh Park; and such works and the lands to be taken for the purposes thereof will be situated in the borough, township, parish, and county aforesaid, and the foreshores respectively adjacent thereto.

To authorise the Corporation to maintain and continue their existing gas works, and to erect and maintain new gas works, with all necessary houses, buildings, gasometers, gasholders, retorts, and other apparatus upon the following lands, situate in the township, parish, and county aforesaid.

A piece or parcel of land, belonging to the trustees, outside the present limits of the borough, and in the township, parish and county aforesaid, situate on the north side of Butt's-lane, extending 783 feet on the north and south sides respectively, and 284 feet on the east and west sides respectively, and containing in the whole 5 acres or thereabouts.

The boundary of the said piece or parcel of land commences in Butt's-lane, at a point 244 yards eastwards from the point at which Butt's-lane crosses Blowick-lane, at the present boundary of the borough, and runs on the north side of Butt's-lane from the said point eastward for 783 feet, from thence it runs at a right angle northwards for 284 feet, and thence again at a

right angle westwards for 783 feet, and again at a right angle southwards for 284 feet, through land of the trustees to the point first mentioned.

To enable the Corporation to maintain the railway siding from the same works to the railway of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, or the existing sidings connected therewith, at or near the junction of Butt's-lane with Meols Cop-road; and to make agreements and arrangements with the owners of such sidings and the said Railway Company and other persons, for the use and enjoyment of the same in connection with the gas works of the Corporation.

To authorise the Corporation to manufacture and sell gas, and the residual products arising from the manufacture thereof, and the matters producible therefrom, and generally to do such acts as are necessary for the manufacture and supply of gas, and to supply gas for public and private purposes within, and to light with gas the borough, and all places within a radius of six miles from the town hall of Southport aforesaid; and to manufacture, hire, supply, or let gas meters, lamps, lamp posts, burners, fittings, and apparatus; to hold and acquire patent rights or licences; to use patent rights in relation to the manufacture or distribution of gas, and the utilization of residual products as aforesaid.

To repeal the provisions made in "The Southport Improvement Act, 1865," for the supply of gas to the district of the Local Board for the township of Birkdale, in the county of Lancaster, and to enable the Corporation to include that district in their limits of supply, and to make provision for the purchase by the Corporation of the plant, mains, pipes, lamps, lamp-posts, burners, fittings, and other apparatus for the supply of gas belonging to the Birkdale Local Board, and other persons within the said district.

To enable the Corporation to regulate the consumption of gas and prevent the waste or misuse thereof, and to make especial provisions for the supply of gas within the township of Birkdale and the limits fixed for the supply thereof by the Corporation.

To authorise the Corporation to lay down and maintain mains, pipes, culverts, and other works for gas and other the purposes aforesaid, in, through, under, over, or across, and for all or any of the purposes of the said Bill, to cross, break-up, alter, divert, or stop-up, either temporarily or permanently, roads, highways, footpaths, bridges, canals, towing-paths, railways, tramways, sewers, drains, streams, brooks, watercourses, and gas pipes, to remove and alter telegraph wires in the borough and in the parishes, townships, extra-parochial and other places within a radius of six miles from the town hall in Southport aforesaid.

To authorise the Corporation to maintain their existing cemetery, and to enlarge the same and build a new cemetery with all proper and necessary chapels, vaults lodges, or other buildings, approaches, and conveniences on a piece of land bounding on the south-west for a distance of 717 feet by the existing cemetery at Southport, on the south-east for a distance of 397 feet by land belonging to the trustees, on the north-east for a distance of 713 feet by other land belonging to the trustees, and on the north-west for a distance of 366 feet by Cemetery-road, and which piece of land contains by admeasurement 6a., 1r., 2p.

To enable the Corporation, on any land now belonging or hereafter to be acquired by them, to erect a town hall, county court, court house, and offices, and approaches thereto.

To enable the corporation to maintain, improve, enlarge, and regulate the use of the town hall,

market, market-house, and other public buildings, from time to time vested in the Corporation, and to regulate the times for holding and the duration of markets and fairs; to abolish existing markets and fairs, and establish others, and to take lands for the purpose of providing and to provide sites and buildings for new markets and fairs, with approaches thereto, and all works and conveniences therefor.

The lands to be taken for the purposes of markets and fairs are the following, viz. :—

Certain lands and houses abutting on Chapel-street, and being Nos. 9, 11, 13, 13A, 15, 17, and 17A, in the said street, and certain other lands and houses abutting on Sharrock-street, and between the two said streets, in the occupation of Alice Carr, Amos Rimmer, Hannah Lunt, John Lawton, James Farrer, Jeffrey Rimmer, Isaac Dean, Thomas Sawyer, John Mansion, James Livesay, Thomas Stirrup, and Richard Sharrock.

Also a strip of land at the corner of Sharrock-street and the toy market, in the occupation of Alexander Steel, junior.

And also a portion of land and houses in Dean's-Court, in the occupation of James Cranshaw, David Ball, William Bibby, Richard Rimmer, and Joseph Nichols, all which lands are within the borough, township, parish, and county aforesaid.

To maintain or provide and maintain and regulate the use of parks and places of public recreation, and to lay out, drain, plant, or ornament the same, and erect therein such buildings as may be expedient for the better enjoyment thereof by the public.

To maintain or provide and maintain and regulate the use of libraries and museums.

To provide, erect, and maintain public clocks.

To prohibit the holding of any unauthorised market or fair, and the exposing or offering for sale within the borough of animals or goods, except in a dwelling-house or shop, or a market-place or fair authorised by or in pursuance of a licence granted by the Corporation.

To provide, license, and regulate public weighing machines, slaughter-houses, and knackers yards, and to prohibit, restrict, license, or regulate the use of existing and future slaughter-houses and knackers yards, and to prevent the slaughter of animals elsewhere than in public or licensed slaughterhouses and knackers yards.

To let the fairs, markets, market-places, and buildings, stands, stalls, and shops, weighing machines, slaughter houses, and knackers yards.

To extend to the borough the Acts 22 and 23 Victoria, chapter 56, and 23 and 24 Victoria, chapter 84, or parts thereof, and provide that no Inspectors of weights and measures, unless appointed by the Corporation, shall have any authority within the borough, and to enable the Corporation to execute the provisions of those Acts, and of the Gunpowder Act, 1860, and the 25th and 26th Victoria, chapter 66, for the safe keeping of petroleum, or of any Acts amending the same Acts.

To maintain or establish and regulate public urinals and waterclosets, pounds, public baths and washhouses, public bathing places, bathing machines and bathing vans, and drying grounds.

To provide for the sewerage [and draining of, and the cleansing the sewers and drains within the borough; and for the carrying away, collecting, distributing, utilising, or selling the sewage, and to enable the Corporation to make such works as may be necessary for the several purposes aforesaid.

To vest in the Corporation all sewers and drains whether public or private within the

borough, with the works and rights thereunto appertaining or necessary to the due supervision thereof.

To authorise the Corporation to make and maintain sewers and drains through private property, and for those purposes to acquire compulsorily easements in, through, and under lands and buildings.

To constitute the Corporation the Surveyors of highways within the borough, and to vest in them all existing and future streets, roads, public bridges, lanes, footways, squares, courts, alleys, passages, and ways within the borough (hereinafter referred to as highways), and the materials thereof, and to enable the Corporation to provide for the draining, levelling, cleansing, paving, watching, lighting, and improving all such highways.

To enable the Corporation to compel the draining, cleansing, paving, and improving any existing or future street, passage, or court (not repairable by the Corporation) by the owners, lessees or occupiers of buildings situate therein, or abutting thereon, or in default thereof, to execute the works necessary for the aforesaid purposes, and to recover the expenses thereof from the said owners, lessees, or occupiers.

To empower the Corporation to regulate the laying out of new streets within the borough, and to prescribe the level line and dimensions, and the time and mode of construction of such new streets, and the lines, frontage, height, and elevation of houses and buildings in such new streets or abutting thereon.

To provide for the naming and altering from time to time the names of existing and future highways within the borough, and the numbering and altering from time to time the numbers of the houses and buildings therein.

To empower the Corporation to authorise any house or building within the borough to be set forward or backward, or to take down or set forward or back any house or building for the improving the line of the street, or line of building, to prevent, remove, or alter projections, obstructions, and dangerous openings in, upon, under, or abutting on any highway, pavement, footpath, or public place.

To empower the Corporation to remove, pull down, repair, or rebuild ruinous or dangerous buildings, and to recover the expenses thereof from the owners, lessees, or occupiers, and to sell the materials of any building so removed or pulled down.

To empower the Corporation to maintain and pay a police force and a fire brigade, and to acquire land, and erect thereon, or on any land belonging to the Corporation, or otherwise, to provide suitable gaols, courthouses, station houses, and other buildings for both forces.

To provide for the construction of buildings to be hereafter erected in the borough in such a way as to prevent fire, and generally to make provision within the borough as to the prevention of fire, consumption of smoke, the heights of chimneys, the position of steam and smoke pipes, and the discharge of steam from factories and other works, and the issuing of smoke or steam from buildings contiguous to highways, public roads, or footpaths, the supplying of public buildings with fresh air, the preventing or regulating the letting of cellars or underground rooms, or other improper or insufficient places or dwelling places, and the regulating the building of houses in courts.

To prohibit, restrict, or regulate the displaying of goods for sale in or upon highways, and the carrying on of dangerous, noxious, or offensive

trades, manufactures, or businesses, to prevent and remove nuisances, annoyances, and obstructions, street music, itinerant shows, and dangerous animals, and the defacing of walls and fences by playcards or writing, to regulate and license brokers, pawnbrokers, scavengers, lodging-houses, hawkers, marine store dealers, places of public entertainment, porters, hackney carriages, carts, and animals plying for hire, and their drivers and attendants, pleasure boats, and persons in charge thereof.

To make provisions as to firing of chimneys, disorderly houses, apprehending and detaining and bailing of offenders and suspected persons, and the punishing indecent, immoral, or disorderly conduct in highways and public places, and generally to confer such powers and make such regulations as may be expedient for the good order and government of the borough, and for imposing penalties for offences.

To authorise the Corporation to purchase and take by compulsion or otherwise, and to take leases or grants of or easements in, under, or over all lands, houses, buildings, and hereditaments required for the purposes of the said Bill or any of them, and to apply any land now vested in them for any of the purposes of the Bill, and to vary or extinguish any rights or privileges connected therewith, and any other rights and privileges which would in any way interfere with any of the objects of the Bill, and confer other rights and privileges.

To authorise the Corporation to sell for gross sums of money or annual rent charges, or to exchange or otherwise dispose of or let for building or any other purposes any lands, buildings, or hereditaments from time to time belonging to or vested in the Corporation, and to sell or dispose of such annual rent charges and the reversion in any lands, buildings, or hereditaments sold upon lease.

To alter any tolls, rates, rents, charges, duties, stallages, or other payments now authorised to be levied by the Corporation, whether by virtue of the before-mentioned Acts or any of them or otherwise, and to authorise the Corporation to levy new tolls, rates, rents, charges, duties, stallages, fees, and payments for all or any of the purposes of the said Bill, to provide remedies for the recovery thereof, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from the payment of any existing or future tolls, rates, rents, charges, duties, stallages, fees, and other payments, and to confer other exemptions, rights, and privileges.

To provide for the payment of all moneys borrowed by the Corporation or the Southport Improvement Commissioners under the authority of any Act of Parliament.

To authorise the Corporation to raise money for all or any of the purposes of the Bill by mortgage of their lands, hereditaments, property, borough fund, borough rate, or revenues, or of any tolls, rates, rents, charges, duties, stallages, fees, or other payments levied, or received by the Corporation, or to be authorised or levied by the Bill.

To enable the Corporation from time to time to make and alter bye-laws and regulations for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and to impose penalties for breach of non-observance thereof.

The Bill will vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would interfere with its objects, and will enable the Corporation, acting by the Council of the borough, to carry into effect the objects of the Bill.

Plans and sections describing the lines, levels, and situations of the intended works, and the lands, houses, or other property which will or may

be taken under the powers of the Bill, together with a book of reference to such plans, containing the names of the owners and lessees, or reputed owners and lessees, and of the occupiers of such lands, houses, and other property; and a copy of this notice, as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection, on or before the 30th day of November, with the Clerk of the Peace for the county palatine of Lancaster, at his office at Preston; and on or before the same day, a copy of so much of the said plans and sections, and book of reference as relates to each parish, township, or extra-parochial place in or through which the intended works will be made, or in which any lands, houses, or other property are intended to be taken; and a copy of this notice will be deposited with the parish clerk of each such parish at his residence, and in the case of any extra-parochial place, with the parish clerk of some parish immediately adjoining such extra-parochial place at his place of abode.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the 21st day of December next.
