WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby, grant and appropriate, out of our common fund, to the rectory of Westbere, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury, one capital sum of five hundred and eighty-five pounds two shillings and two pence, such capital sum to be applied by us in discharging the amount payable to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation and maintenance of the Poor Clergy, under a subsisting mortgage of the said rectory of Westbere, which was effected by a deed bearing date the second day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, for the purpose of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said rectory of Westbere.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this third day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of

the vicarage of Saint Bartholomew, Ruswarp, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, and to his successors Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of three hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the nineteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May, and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said vicarage, one capital sum of one thousand and four hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of three hundred pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such
