Mersey and Irwell Protection.

(Extension of Remedies under the Mersey, &c., Protection Act, 1862; Amendment of Act.)

A PPLICATION is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session thereof, for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following among other purposes.

1. To amend and extend the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the year 1862, "to protect the waters of the Mersey and the Irwell, and of certain of their tributaries from certain obstructions," (25 and 26 Vic. cap. 222), and especially to provide more effectual remedies for any

violation of the provisions of the said Act, and amongst other things to enable the Court of Chancery, and any other Court having equitable jurisdiction, in certain circumstances to grant injunctions, so as to restrain any person or persons who or whose workmen, agents, or servants have been previously convicted under the said Act, and his or their agents, servants, and workmen from violating its provisions.

2. Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the 21st day of December next.
