Gisborough Water Supply.

Application to the Board of Trade for Provisional Order for Powers to construct and maintain Water Works, and to supply the Township of Gisborough with Water, and to acquire Lands by agreement for that purpose.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade, on or before the twenty-third day of December next, by Thomas Chaloner, of Gisborough, in the county of York, Esquire, Rear-Admiral in Her Majesty's Fleet; and Thomas Tudor Trevor, of the same place, attorney-at-law, hereinafter called the undertakers, for a provisional order, under "The Gas and Water Works Facilities Act, 1870," for the following, or some of the following among other purposes, namely:—

To supply water for private consumption, and for domestic, trade, public, sanitary, and other purposes, within, or to the whole or any part of the town and township of Gisborough, in the North Riding of the county of York, and to enable the Local Board of Health for the township of Gisborough, and any other Local Board Commissioners and other public and local bodies and persons, to enter into agreements with the Undertakers in reference to any of the objects and purposes of the proposed Provisional Order. To construct and maintain the following water works, with all necessary approaches, embankments, filtering beds, drains, sluices, culverts, shafts, pipes, works, and conveniences, namely:

A reservoir of one thousand superficial square yards in extent or thereabouts, situate wholly in the township and parish of Gisborough aforesaid, on land belonging to the said Thomas Chaloner, Esquire, and which reservoir when made will be wholly surrounded by other lands belonging to the said Thomas Chaloner, and will be formed by an embankment or dam across the stream or beck flowing through Warming Pits Wood, at a point on the said stream situate about fifty yards to the south-west of the junction of the said stream or beck with Wiley Cat Beck, and extending to a point about four hundred yards to the south-west of the same junction:

A conduit or line of pipes wholly situate in the township and parish of Gisborough aforesaid,

commencing from and out of the northern end of the before-mentioned reservoir, passing through the lands of the said Thomas Chaloner into the highway leading from Gisborough to Whitby, and thence along the said highway to a street in Gisborough called Bow-street, and thence along the said street into and through the several other public streets and roads of the town of Gisborough aforesaid:

To authorize the Undertakers to abstract and take a sufficient supply of water from the said stream or beck flowing through Warming Pits Wood, at a point in the said stream or beck at the southern end of the proposed reservoir (which point will be in the township and parish of Gisborough), and from the several tributaries thereof above such reservoir and other waters and springs which now directly or derivatively flow or proceed into or supply the said stream above such reservoir, and to prevent the pollution or contamination of the water of the said stream, and of the several tributaries thereof respectively.

To purchase, take on lease, or otherwise acquire by agreement the lands necessary for the construction of the said reservoir and other works, and any easements and rights in or over the same.

To levy rates, rents, and charges for the supply of water within the township of Gisborough, and to define and regulate a supply of water, and to prevent the waste, illegal use, abstraction or misuse, and wrongful use of the water, and to adopt proper and needful regulations in reference thereto, and to inflict penalties upon or otherwise punish persons guilty of any such wrongful act.

To lay down mains, pipes, culverts, and other works and apparatus in, under, across, or along, and to divert, break up, alter, or stop up, either temporarily or permanently, streets, roads, highways, bridges, railways, tramways, sewers, drains, rivers, watercourses, towing-paths, passages, and places within the township and parish of Gisborough.

And notice is hereby also given, than on or before the 30th day of November, 1870, proper plans and sections of the proposed works, with a copy of this notice, will be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace of the North Riding of the county of York, at his office at Northallerton, in the said Riding, and at the offices of the Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, London.

And notice is hereby further given, that on and after the 23rd day of December next, printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be deposited at the offices of Messrs. T. T. and W. C. Trevor, Solicitors, Gisborough, at which place such copies, when deposited, and also copies of the Provisional Order when made, will be obtainable by all persons applying for the same at the price of one shilling each.
