TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. Any publication coming within the following description shall be deemed a newspaper for the purpose of being sent by post from any place within the United Kingdom to any place out of the United Kingdom at newspaper rates as hereinafter mentioned, although the same may not be registered for inland transmission in pursuance of the Post Office Act, 1870 (that is to say)—Any publication consisting wholly or in great part of political or other news, or of articles relating thereto, or to other current topics, with or without advertisements, subject to these conditions:—

That it be printed and published within the United Kingdom;

That it be published in numbers, at intervals of not more than thirty-one days;

That it have the full title and date of publication printed at the top of the first page, and the whole or part of the title and the date of publication, printed at the top of every subsequent page.

2. The following shall, for the purpose of being sent by post from any place within the United

Kingdom to any place out of the United Kingdom, together with a newspaper and as part thereof, be deemed to be a supplement (that is to say)—A publication consisting wholly or in great part of matter like that of a newspaper, or of advertisements, printed on a sheet or sheets or a piece or pieces of paper unstitched, or consisting wholly or in part of engravings, prints, or lithographs, illustrative of articles in the newspaper, such publication in every case being published with the newspaper, and having the title and date of publication of the newspaper printed at the top of every page, or at the top of every sheet or side on which any such engraving, print, or lithograph appears.

3. The proprietor or printer of any newspaper within the description aforesaid may register it for transmission abroad as aforesaid, at the General Post Office, on payment to the Postmaster-General of a fee of five shillings.

4. The registration for transmission abroad as aforesaid of any such newspaper as aforesaid may be renewed from year to year on payment to the Postmaster-General of a like fee of five-shillings.

5. Any newspaper or packet of newspapers may be sent by post with or without a supplement or supplements from any place within the United Kingdom to any place out of the United Kingdom, according to the Treasury Warrants and Post Office Regulations for the time being subsisting in that behalf, at such rates of postage as are now payable in respect of such transmission, or at such other rates of postage not exceeding three pence for each newspaper irrespectively of any colonial or foreign postage as shall from time to time be prescribed by any Warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, on the following conditions, that is to say :—

(a). That every such newspaper be registered for transmission abroad as aforesaid, or be registered for inland transmission in pursuance of the Post Office Act, 1870.

(b). That every such newspaper be posted within eight days from the date of publication thereof including the day of publication.

(c). That the postage be prepaid by a postage stamp or stamps.

(d). That every such newspaper or packet be posted either without a cover or in a cover open at both ends, and so that the same can be easily removed for the purpose of examination.

(e). That every such newspaper when posted be so folded and so covered, (if posted in a cover) as to permit the title to be readily inspected.

(f). That no such newspaper whether posted singly or in a packet be posted with any enclosure concealed therein, or in the supplement or supplements belonging thereto.

(g). That there be no writing or other pen or pencil mark on any such newspaper except the name and address of the person to whom it is sent, nor anything on the cover (if any) of any such newspaper or packet, except such name and address, the printed title of the newspaper, the printed name and address of the publisher or vendor who sends it, and words indicating the date on which the subscription to such newspaper will end.

6. Provided that if any publication which shall be registered as a newspaper as aforesaid, or shall be registered for inland transmission in pursuance of the Post Office Act, 1870, shall be published in numbers at intervals of less than 31 days, no two or more numbers thereof shall be deemed to be a single number of a newspaper within the meaning

of this Warrant if any one or more of such numbers shall have been published for more than eight days reckoned as aforesaid, although all such numbers may have been published within one and the same period of 31 days.

7. All Warrants heretofore at any time made under the hands of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any two or more of them, which relate to newspapers transmitted, or intended to be transmitted, by post from any place within the United Kingdom to any place out of the United Kingdom shall be and the same are hereby repealed, revoked, and annulled so far and so far only as the same authorize the transmission in manner aforesaid of any newspaper otherwise than in conformity with the conditions hereinbefore prescribed.

8. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury by Warrant under their hands, or under the hands of any two of them, duly made at any time hereafter, to alter, repeal, or revoke the regulations and conditions hereby made and to make and establish any new or other regulations in lieu thereof.

9. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 1st day of December, 1870.
