LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ORDER SETTLING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT OF TETTENHALL AND COMPTON, IN THE COUNTY OF STAFFORD, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

WHEREAS a petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from owners and ratepayers

resident within the boundaries of a proposed district of Tettenhall and Compton, in the parish of Tettenhall, in the county of Stafford, praying me to settle the boundaries of such district for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And whereas the said petition was duly signed, as required by the said Act, and set forth, likewise, the proposed boundaries of the district sought to be formed under its provisions; and inquiry has now been made by Robert Morgan, Esquire, the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose, and he has reported to me thereon.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said Petition and Report into consideration, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Local Government Act, 1858, make order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described and delineated on the plan referred to in, and accompanying, the Inspector's Report, dated the 26th day of January, 1871, form and constitute the boundaries of the district to be called the "Tettenhall and Compton District," for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858; and that the parts included in such boundaries so described and delineated shall, for the purposes of such Act, be deemed to be a place having a known and defined boundary, and may adopt the said Act accordingly.

The aforesaid boundaries commence at the point A (on the plan of the district which accompanies the Inspector's report), on the brook course that here forms the boundary between the parishes of Wolverhampton and Tettenhall; thence, westward, along the said brook course to B, on the Bell-lane Bridge at Wightwick; thence, northward, along the west side of the said Bell-lane, and including it to C, at Long Lake Bridge, over the watercourse called "The Penk;" thence, eastward, along the said watercourse to D, on the north side of Green-lane; thence, eastward, along the south and east sides of field numbered 1081, and east side of field numbered 1082, to E, at Red House-lane; thence, eastward, along the north side of plot numbered 136, and field numbered 137, to F; thence crossing Red House-lane and eastward along the north side of the public footway that divides fields numbered 1129 and 132 to G, on the Holyhead Turnpike-road; thence crossing the said turnpike-road and eastward along the south side of fields numbered 1132, 1135, 1136, and 1137, to H, on the road leading from Tettenhall to the Wergs; thence crossing the said road and eastward along the south side of the fields numbered 1151, 1152, 1155, and 1182, to I, at Stockwell-lane; thence, south-eastward, along the north side of the said lane, and including it to the Codsall-road; thence crossing this road and eastward along the north side of Sandy-lane, and including it to K, at the junction with Aldersley-lane; thence crossing Aldersley-lane and north-eastward along the north and east sides of field numbered 1376 to the starting point at A, thus completing the boundaries.

2. That Mr. Edwin Pritchard, of Tettenhall, be Summoning Officer, and take forthwith all such steps as may be necessary, under the hereinbefore recited Act, for convening a meeting of the ratepayers of the said district of Tettenhall and Compton to decide as to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, within the boundaries of such district, as fixed and settled by this Order.
