

At night, a light is to be carried at the peak, besides the ordinary lights, as far up as Trompe-loup, and beyond it at the mainmast head.

In approaching the forts, steamers must blow their whistles and stop and blow off steam before passing.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, a translation of a note of the Spanish Government, stating that quarantine will be imposed at Spanish ports on vessels coming with a foul bill of health from Bordeaux, French Asiatic possessions, Fernando Po, Zanzibar, and Eastern Coast of Africa, Brazil, Persian Gulf, Genoa, and Toulon, if the two last have smallpox marked in their bills of health; and that quarantine of observation must be imposed on those coming from Malta, Eastern Coast of Africa, Ottoman Empire, Greece, Tunis, Genoa, and Toulon, if those coming from the two last-named ports come under the conditions laid down in Art. 30 of the Law of Health.

The Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have also received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid:—

"Vessels coming from France to Spain are placed in three days' quarantine of observation."

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Bordeaux, a copy of a Decree of the Government of the National Defence, dated the 28th ultimo, of which the following is a translation:—

Articles of harness, equipment, and clothing bought or to be bought abroad on account of either the Departments of War, Marine, or the Interior, are admitted free at all the Custom-houses on the French frontier, on condition of a declaration indicating the quantity and the destination.

Exception will be made in the case of purchases already made in which the vendors shall have engaged to defray the duties of entry.
