

deemed to have been constituted a Special Drainage District for the purposes of the said Sewage Utilization Acts, 1865 and 1867; and whereas, in pursuance of such provisions, a memorial has been presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from owners and ratepayers of the District of Ivybridge, in the county of Devon, which District has been lately defined and settled by Order, dated the 9th day of January, 1871, and published in the London Gazette, praying that the same District may be constituted a Special Drainage District, under the 8th section of the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, having taken the said petition into consideration, do hereby, under the authority conferred upon me by the said Acts, order and direct, that—

1. From and after the date of this present Order, the boundaries hereinafter described shall form and constitute the Special Drainage District of Ivybridge; that is to say:—

The boundaries of the District of Ivybridge commence at the point A (on the plan of the district which accompanies the Inspector's report of 6th January, 1871), in the centre of the River Erme, and on the boundary between the parishes of Cornwood and Harford; thence, eastward, crossing the wood No. 71 to B; thence, southward, along the west side of fields Nos. 70 and 44, and the west and south sides of the field No. 24, crossing the South Devon Railway and road to Stowford House, and along the north side of field No. 19 to C, at the south-west corner of field No. 26; thence, southward, along the west side of fields Nos. 27 and 18; thence, eastward, along the north side of fields Nos. 10, 11, and 4, to D; thence, southward, along the east side of field No. 4 to E, on the centre of the Plymouth and Exeter Turnpike-road and boundary between the parishes of Harford and Uxborough; thence, eastward, along the said parish boundary to F, at the north-east corner of plot No. 200; thence, southward, along the public footpath which crosses fields Nos. 203, 202, and 208A, and along the south-west side of fields Nos. 215 and 216 to G, on the road to Torhill and Godwill; thence, southward, along the west side of fields Nos. 161, 149, 150, 143, 142, and 124 to H; thence, westward, along the south side of fields Nos. 111, 109, 106, 99, and 98 to I; thence, southward, along the east side of fields Nos. 75, 72, and 69 to K, on the road between Ivybridge and Ugborough; thence crossing the said road and along the watercourse that intersects field No. 71 to L, in the centre of the River Erme, the boundary between the parishes of Ugborough and Ermington; thence crossing the said river, and westward, along the watercourse and south side of fields Nos. 292, 293, 298, 299, and 304 to M; thence, northward, and crossing the Plymouth and Exeter turnpike road along the west side of fields Nos. 304 and 303 to N; thence along the north side of field No. 306 to O, on the old road from Plymouth to Exeter; thence crossing the said road, and northward, along the west side of the lane leading to Woodland Cross, and including it to P, at Woodland Cross, on the boundary between the parishes of Ermington and Cornwood; thence, northward, along the east side of fields Nos. 41, 40, 39, 38, 57, and 114 to Q; thence, eastward, along the north side of Henlake Down, No. 25, to the starting point at A, in the River Erme, so completing the boundaries of the District.

2. That the Reverend George Thomas Kingdon, Ivybridge, be Summoning Officer, and take forth-

with all such steps as may be necessary for all or any of the purposes of the Sanitary and Sewage Utilization Acts.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the benefice of Saint Luke, Leicester, in the county of Leicester, and in the diocese of Peterborough, and to his successors Incumbents of the same benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May, and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said benefice, one capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said benefice, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of one hundred pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this twenty-third day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.
