Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE TOWNSHIP OF DINAS, IN THE COUNTY OF MERIONETH.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, was, on the 25th day of January, 1871, passed by the owners and ratepayers of the township of Dinas, in the county of Merioneth, and notice of such adoption has been given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act: and whereas it has now been certified to me, that a copy of such notice has been duly advertised, and that copies have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in the township to which notices are usually affixed, and the period fixed by the said Act for appeal has now expired, and no such appeal has been made: And whereas, although the said township is a place with a population of less than 3,000 by the last census, it has appeared to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that by reason of the special circumstances, it is expedient that the said township should be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby approve of such adoption by the township aforesaid; and do further Order that such Act shall, at the expiration of two months from the date of the passing of the aforesaid resolution of adoption, have the force of law within such township of Dinas.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 18.)—JAPAN—NIPON—SIMODA HARBOUR.

Fixed Light on Rock Island.

THE Japanese Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of January, 1871, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Rock Island, off Simoda Harbour, Nipon.

The light is a *fixed* white light as seen from seaward, but *red* inshore, between the bearings N.W. and N. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. from the lighthouse; it is elevated 164 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the first order.

The tower, 75 feet high, is built of white stone. Position, lat. $34^{\circ} 34' 20''$ N., long. $138^{\circ} 57' 10''$ E.

NOTE.—The red portion of the light will cover all the dangers between Rock Island and the shore, and its eastern edge will lead into Simoda Harbour.

Also, that the temporary light exhibited on the Island would be discontinued.
