Windsor Castle, 21st March, 1871.

CEREMONIAL observed at the Marriage of Her Royal Highness The Princess Louise Caroline Alberta, Fourth Daughter of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and of His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony and Prince of Saxe Coburg and Gotha, with John Douglas Sutherland, Marquis of Lorne, in Saint George's Chapel, Windsor, on Tuesday, the 21st March, 1871.

The Ambassadors, Foreign Ministers, Cabinet Ministers, and others invited to be present at the Ceremony, arrived by Special Train from London, and proceeded in Carriages provided for the purpose direct from the Windsor Terminus of the Great Western Railway to the Entrance of Saint George's Chapel, near Wolsey Chapel, and were at once shown to the Seats reserved for them in the Choir.

The Duke and Duchess of Argyll and others of the nearest Relatives of the Bridegroom arrived from Windsor Castle, and were shown to Seats reserved for them on the Haut Pas, near the Altar.

The Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Bishop of Winchester (Prelate of the Order of the Garter), The Bishop of Oxford (Bishop of the Diocese and Chancellor of the Order of the Garter), The Bishop of Worcester (Clerk of the Closet), The Honourable and Very Reverend The Dean of Windsor (Lord High Almoner, Registrar of the Order of the Garter, and Domestic Chaplain to Her Majesty), with the Canons and Minor Canons of Windsor, assembled at the Deanery, and took their places within the rails of the Altar.

With His Supporters, The Earl Percy, and The Lord Ronald Leveson Gower, arrived from Windsor Castle at the South Entrance to the Chapel, where he was received by The Vice-Chamberlain, and conducted to the Bray Chapel, which had been prepared for his reception.

When The Royal Family had taken their places on the Haut Pas, the Vice-Chamberlain conducted The Bridegroom to the Seat provided for him on the Haut Pas, accompanied by his Supporters, who remained near him. As he proceeded up the Chapel the Organ played Handel's March from the Oratorio of "Joseph."

The Bridesmaids assembled at the West Entrance to Saint George's Chapel, and there awaited in a Room prepared for the purpose, the arrival of Her Royal Highness The Bride.

The Queen was conducted to the Seat prepared for Her Majesty near the Bride, and Their Royal Highnesses The Prince of Wales and The Duke of Saxe Coburg and Gotha were also placed near Her Royal Highness.

The Service was performed by The Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal) in the absence of The Archbishop of Canterbury.

The Choir sang two Psalms (Double Chant) by Dr. G. J. Elvey; and, before the Blessing, a Chorus by Beethoven.

The Bride was given away by Her Majesty The Queen.

At the conclusion of the Ceremony, a Royal Salute was fired in the Long Walk, from a Battery of the Royal Horse Artillery; and the March from Handel's "Occasional Oratorio" was played on the Organ as the Royal Personages and their Suites left the Chapel in the following order by the West Door :-

At four o'clock the Bride and Bridegroom left Windsor Castle, accompanied by a Captain's Escort of the Second Regiment of Life Guards, and proceeded to Claremont, attended by Lady Churchill, Lady of the Bedchamber, and the Earl of Mountcharles, Equerry in Waiting to Her Majesty.

A Banquet was given in the Evening, in honour of the occasion, in the Waterloo Chamber, at which the Lord Steward presided, and proposed the following Toast:—
