In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-

bation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs,

a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, inclosing the following translation of a law making certain alterations in the Danish Sugar Duties:—

SECTION 1.

The following alterations shall be made in the Law of 4th July, 1863, concerning the Customs, and Shipping Duties and Dues; and in the Law of 5th August, 1864, concerning the War Tax on the import of merchandise.

All Muscovados sugars which are darker than the Amsterdam Standard Sample No. 15, shall pay duty according to the Customs Tariffs' running number 229.

And all other pulverised sugars (not Muscovados) answering to the Amsterdam Standard Sample No. 15 and thereabove, but darker than No. 19, shall be removed from the Tariff running numbers 227 and 228, and entered under a special running number as 227b, with a Custom's Duty of $3\frac{1}{10}$ skilling per lb.; and a War Tax of $1\frac{1}{10}$ skilling per lb.

SECTION 2.

On importation all Muscovado sugars must be declared as such: If this be omitted they will be entered for duty as other raw sugars. Improper declarations of sugars, as Muscovados sugar, will be punished according to the ordinary Customs Law.

SECTION 3.

All the pulverised sugars coming under the Nos. 228, 229, of the Law of 4th July, 1863, as well as those sugars just mentioned in Section 1, under the running number 227b, shall be admitted in bond on the conditions mentioned under running number 228 of the above mentioned law.

SECTION 4.

The following tare shall be allowed on the sugars mentioned in the foregoing sections:—

SECTION 5.

This law comes into operation on the 1st of April, 1871; and will remain in force until a new Customs Law (Tariff) is issued, but not, however, beyond the 1st April, 1873.

“For not having the manifest drawn up on arriving in Spanish waters, a fine of 1000 pesetas, and for not having it made in conformity with the requisitions stated in Articles 46 and 47, 100 to 1000 pesetas, according to the gravity of the case; but omissions of weights, names of consignees and shippers, and other matters of small importance, may be altered at once, provided that no addition or amelioration be made in that which is manifested as regards the number of packages, or the quantities, when treating of loose cargoes.”

THE following Notice to Mariners for the approach to Kurrachee Harbour has been received from the Bombay Government, and is published for the information of Ship Owners, Masters, and others.

Marine Department.

HIS Excellency in Council is pleased to publish, for general information, the following revised directions for approaching the Kurrachee Harbour:—

Directions for approaching Kurrachee Harbour, with the depth Vessels should load to at different seasons of the year, to ensure crossing the Bar without detention:—

Latitude of the lighthouse on

Manora Point 24° 47' 21" N.

Longitude 66° 58' 15" E.

The light is a fixed one, 119 feet above the sea level, visible in clear weather 17 miles; in the hazy weather prevalent during the south-west monsoon, 7 to 9 miles only.

High-water at full and change of the moon 10h. 30'; rise and fall on ordinary spring tides, 9 feet 6 inches.

Depth of water on the bar, in the south-west monsoon season, May to September:—

Spring tides 22 to 23 feet 6 inches.

Neap tides 19 to 18 feet.

Fine weather season, October to April:—

Spring tides 20 to 21 feet 6 inches.

Neap tides 19 to 18 feet.

SHIPS MAY LOAD

From September 15th to April 15th (the bar being generally smooth):—

Spring tides 20 feet.

Neap tides 18 feet.

From April 15th to the end of May, from September 15th to the 30th, periods before and after the south-west monsoon:—

Spring tides 18 feet 6 inches.

Neap tides 17 feet 6 inches.

From June 1st to the middle of September, with the average weather in the south-west monsoon:—

Spring tides 17 feet.

Neap tides 15 feet.

There are days during this monsoon when the sea on the bar is so heavy that ships at the above draft cannot with safety cross, and it is advisable not to send out vessels of above 600 tons' burthen during the bad weather season.

APPROACHING THE PORT.

COAST OF SIND.

Indus Bank.

The coast of Sind below the parallel of 24° north latitude should be approached with great caution—20 fathoms water being found (in places) within 2 miles, and 10 fathoms water close to the outer edge of the banks, which extend to the south-west from the Kokawarry mouth of the Indus.

To the north of the above parallel, caution is still necessary, and the coast should not be approached under 14 fathoms; this line of soundings will carry a ship from 7 to 9 miles only off the Hujamree and Kediwarry banks of the river, 10 fathoms being found in places close to their extreme edge.

The set of the tides and currents off these banks is very uncertain; the land is low throughout, and barely visible in clear weather from the outer edge (of the banks).

Too much attention cannot be paid to the lead on this coast, more especially in passing the banks off the Indus.

Ras Muari (or Cape Monze), distant 18 miles W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the western entrance to Kurrachee, is high and bold of approach. Ships, during the south-west monsoon season, should make this headland, running to the eastward for Manora Point, keeping it (Manora Point) on any bearing to the north of east.

Manora Point, forming the west side of Kurrachee Harbour, is 100 feet in height, and can be approached to within half a mile on any bearing from north to east, with 5 fathoms water; on this point stands the lighthouse and signal station. As at certain times of tide pilots cannot get off, attention should be given to all directions signalled from the shore.

Masters of ships should not, under any circumstances, attempt to enter the port without a pilot.

ANCHORAGE IN THE ROADS.

From June to the middle of September, ships should not on any account anchor, but stand off, and on keeping the lighthouse bearing from N. by

E. to N.E., 1 to 2 miles distant, until boarded by a pilot, or directed by signal.

September 15th till the end of March—

Anchorage lighthouse N. by E. to N.N.E. : distance 1 mile 7 fathoms.

April and May—

Lighthouse N.N.E. to N.E. ; distance 1½ miles in 8 fathoms
