## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no

presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Law of the Portuguese Government, dated 30th ultimo, relative to the abolition of Transit Duty :—

Art. 1. The transit of all goods and merchandize and articles of commerce, for exportation to foreign countries, between Elvas and the cities of Lisbon and Oporto, and between the two latter and the former, is free.

Art. 2. The transit duty of one per thousand ad valorem, levied in virtue of the 3rd Article of the Law of the 22nd of February, 1861, and which was extended to the railways in virtue of the 17th Article of the Regulations of the 28th of November, 1864, is hereby abolished.

Art. 3. The abolition of the transit duty does not exempt merchandize from the fiscal supervision to which it is subject in accordance with the regulations in force.

Art. 4. All legislation to the contrary is hereby revoked.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received,

from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, stating that—

In consequence of the outbreak of epidemic cholera at St. Petersburg, the Danish Government have, in date of the 5th instant, put in force certain quarantine regulations with respect to all vessels touching at or entering the Port of Copenhagen, coming from the Russian Capital and Cronstadt.

These regulations enact, that all vessels arriving from an infected port or place shall neither land passengers nor crew, nor have any communication with the shore until the Quarantine Doctor has been on board and granted them free pratique.

Vessels coming from such infected ports or places shall, on arrival in the roads, immediately hoist the quarantine flag, or in place thereof a white flag, on the main-top.

Masters neglecting to comply with these regulations will render themselves liable to a fine of 200 rigsdollars (about £21).

“ hereby given to authorize the Overseers,  
“ with the consent of the Poor Law Board,  
“ to provide a Vestry Hall for public meet-  
“ ings on Parochial Business, and a proper  
“ Depository for all the Documents, Books,  
“ and Papers belonging to the Township, and  
“ to adopt the provisions of the Statute 13  
“ and 14 Vict., c. 57, or such part or parts  
“ thereof as may be applicable for the  
“ purpose.”

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said township have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “ An Act to prevent the holding of “ Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for “ regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings for the transaction of any business of or relating to the said township of Wortley, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township.

ARTICLE II.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

#### ALTERATION.

WHEREAS at the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, holden at Saint Augustine's, near Canterbury, in and for the county of Kent, on Tuesday, the 4th day of April, 1871, a Provisional Order was made in the words following, that is to say :—

At the General Quarter Session of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden at Saint Augustine's, near Canterbury, in and for the county of Kent, on Tuesday in the week next after the thirty-first

day of March, to wit, the 4th day of April, 1871, and in the thirty-fourth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, before Edward Hugessen Knatchbull-Hugessen, Esquire, M.P., the Reverend George Wilson Sicklemore, Peter Marten, Esquire, and others their fellows Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to preserve the Peace of our said Lady the Queen in the said county, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdemeanors done and committed therein.

Whereas pursuant to a requisition under the hands of five Justices of the Peace in and for the county of Kent, the Clerk of the Peace of the said county added to, and sent with, the notice required by law to be given for the holding of the present Quarter Sessions of the Peace for this county, a notice, as near as circumstances would admit, in the form marked A in the schedule of the statute 25 and 26 Vict., c. 61, that at the Court therein mentioned, a proposal would be made to the Justices in such Court of Quarter Sessions assembled, to alter the New Romney Highway District, in the said county, which had been formed under the said Act, in the manner hereinbelow ordered.

It is provisionally ordered, on the application of the parish of West Hythe, in the said county, and with the consent of the inhabitants of the said parish in vestry assembled, and of the Town Council of the borough of Hythe, in the said county, in which borough the part of the said parish hereinafter mentioned is situate, that the said New Romney Highway District be altered by adding thereto that part of the said parish of West Hythe which is within the limits of the said borough of Hythe, and is not now included in the said highway district.

And this Court doth appoint the next Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden at Saint Augustine's, near Canterbury, in and for the said county of Kent, on the 27th day of June next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the taking into consideration the confirmation of this Provisional Order by a Final Order.
