

a whole Ox, fill'd with several sorts of Fowl, and other things in its Belly, to be roasted on the Eminence of *Trinita di Monte*, which is near his Palace: And having thus provided abroad for the Common People, he sumptuously entertain'd within an Innumerable company of Persons of Quality of both Sexes, with all the Delicacies *Rome* could afford. But that which gave Life to this great Solemnity was the continual *Viva's*, or Cries of the People, even of those of high Rank, which deaded not only the exquisite Musick which he had provided, but the very noise of the Trumpets and Drums, nay, of the Chambers and Mortars themselves: And what was yet farther surprizing, a great many Houses of Cardinals, Princes, and Prelates, being illuminated, seem'd all on Fire during the destin'd time for this joyful Triumph.

Venice, Aug. 6. By a Vessel just now arrived from the *Levant* we hear, That the Doge had quitted the Delight upon *Candia*, having understood that the Disorders there were appeas'd; and had turned towards *Negrepont*, which was believ'd by the whole Force of this State both by Land and Sea. The Venetian Army was never so strong in all this War, as now, being composed of above 24000 fighting Men, most Germans and Switzers, old Troops.

Vienna, August 5. We have had no Letters from the Imperial Army since those of the 25th past, which told us, That they were then marching towards the *Save*, with a Resolution, so soon as the Elector of *Bavaria* was arrived, to pass that River, which in all appearance will be one of the Noblest Actions of this Campaign; The Turks drawing thither all the Force they can to oppose them. *Tegheh* Bassa was at last, as we hear, come to *Belgrade*, with the Troops he had with him at *Sophia*, where having, at his arrival, caus'd it to be published, that the Sultan had appointed him to be Serasquier of *Hungary*, the Garrison, as well as the other Forces that were Encamped in the Neighborhood, had submitted to his Command. Having thus got the Power into his Hands, he immediately shew'd his resentment against *Hassan* Bassa his Competitor, whose Tents, Horses and Money he seized on, and would have had him strangled, had he not been prevented by the Interposition of the Aga of the Janizaries, and the Son of the Cham of *Tartary*, who was there with a small Body of Tartars. We have advic'd that the Count *de Hofkirken*, who had been detached by Prince *Louis* of *Baden* with 800 German Horse toward *Prodt*, to observe the Enemy, being on the 14th past come to the *Save*, with a Reinforcement of 400 Heydukes, who had joined him the day before, he had found there several Barks, in which he caus'd the Heydukes and 400 Horse to pass to the other side of that River, and advancing towards *Prodt*, the Turks that were there, upon their approach, believing that the whole Army, Commanded by Prince *Louis* of *Baden*, had passed the River, abandoned the Fortres and Palanque with great precipitation. The Count *de Hofkirken* enter'd the place, and thought to maintain it till the arrival of the Prince of *Baden*: But three days after he was attack'd by a Body of 7 or 8000 Turks, Horse and Foot, who made several Assaults, in which they spent a whole day; but being as often repuls'd, they retir'd, with the loss of 500 Men. But the Count *de Hofkirken* being inform'd that the Enemy intended to return the day following with a greater Force, and with Cannon, he resolv'd, with the advice of his Officers, seeing the Prince of *Baden* was so far off, that they could not expect any Assistance from him, to retire with his Men, and the Booty they had got, which was very considerable, which he accordingly executed, after having ruin'd the place, and repass'd the *Save* without any Opposition from the Enemy. *Sigeth* and *Camisa* continue to be very closely blockt up, so that those Garrisons cannot now stir abroad, and we are assur'd that they begin to be in want of Provisions. They write from *Segedin*, That General *Cassava*, being recovered of the Indisposition that had detain'd him there, intend'd to part from thence the 20. of the last Month to join the Army. It is not the Bishop of *Nicopolis*, but another of the Deputies, that is returned to *Valachia*, to desire a more ample Power; And in the mean time the said Bishop and his Colleague continue their Conferences with the Imperial Commissioners; It is not doubted if *Belgrade* be taken, but the Treaty with them will be quickly concluded.

Hague, August 20. Yesterday Morning arriv'd here several Expresses, with Advice, that the Baron *d'Elderen*, Great Dean of that Cathedral, was, the 17th Instant, chosen Bishop and Prince of *Liege*; He had 26 Voices, and the Cardinal of *Furstenberg* 18: After the Election had been proclaimed, he was accompanied by the Prince of *Neuburg*, Great Master of the *Turkish* Order, to his Palace, where he received the Compliments of the Chief of the Country, and other Persons of Quality. The Troops of this State that are to encamp on the *Mooser Heyde* in *Gelderland*, have Orders to be there on the first of September. We have an account from *Berlin*, that the Electors of *Brandenburgh* was the Thirteenth Instant de-

liver'd of a Young Prince, to the great Joy of that Court. And that the Princess *Radzeville*, Widow of Prince *Louis* of *Brandenburgh*, was, two days before, Married to Prince *Charles* of *Neubourg*, who had been some time there incognito. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 8th Instant tell us, That the Cattle of *Titul*, within 4 miles of *Belgrade*, in which were 2000 Janizaries, had been surrendered to the Imperialists; and that the Army continued its march towards the *Save*. We receive just now the News of the arrival of our *East-India* Ships, 11 in number.

Brussels, Aug. 18. His Excellency received last night an account from *Liege* of the Election of the Baron *d'Elderen* to that Bishoprick.

Paris, Aug. 21 On Wednesday last arriv'd here an Express from *Liege*, with the news, That the Baron *d'Elderen*, Great Dean of that Church, was on the 17th Instant chosen Bishop and Prince of *Liege*. We hear from *Rome*, That the Pope had appointed a Congregation of Cardinals, to examine the Election of *Cologne*. It is reported here, That the Imperialists have taken *Gradiska*.

Windsor, Aug. 12. His Majesty has been Graciously pleas'd, to constitute Sir *Eneas* Mackpherson of *Inveresse* Knight, to be Lieutenant Governor of *Nevis* in *America*, in the place of Sir *James Russell*, Deceased, with all the Priviledges and Exemptions thereunto belonging.

The Count *de Grammont* Envoy Extraordinary from *France*, and the Chevalier *de LeCquet*, Envoy from the Duke of *Orleans*, had the 12th Instant their Audiences of Leave of their Majesties, and the 15th of the Queen-Dowager, conducted by Sir *Charles Cottrel*, Master of the Ceremonies.

The Prince *de Bergues*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Governor of *Flanders*, to Congratulate their Majesties upon the Birth of the Prince of *Wales*, had likewise on the 12th Audience of their Majesties, and on the 15th, of the Queen-Dowager, conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

The Marquis *de Rovere*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Republick of *Genova*, to make the same Compliment of Congratulation, had also, on the 12th and 15th, Audience of Their Majesties, and of the Queen Dowager; conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

Count *Hamilton*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector *Palatin*, likewise to congratulate upon the happy Birth of the Prince, had the 12th Audience of the King, and the 13th of the Queen; Conducted by Sir *Charles Cottrel* Master of the Ceremonies.
