THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Versailles, an extract from the "Journal Officiel" of the 17th instant, containing a Decree of the French Government relating to public contracts for war material, &c., and of which the following is a translation :-

Art. 1. A Commission, composed of sixty members of the National Assembly, nominated by the Bureaus at the rate of four members per Bureau, is charged with examining all the contracts passed by the public departments on account of the war, payable wholly or in part by the State, and with checking the regularity of their negotiation and execution.

Art. 2. Copies of all contracts concluded with persons other than those agents authorised for this purpose by laws, decrees, ordinances, or regulations, shall be, on the responsibility of the parties interested, and under pain of forfeiture, addressed within two months from the promulgation of the present law to the proper minister, who will transmit them to the Commission with his observations.

Art. 3. All documents and particulars of a nature to assist the Commission will be immediately placed at its disposition by the competent ministers.

All powers are conferred on the Commission for the purpose of summoning and interrogating persons able to give information and of causing them to communicate any thing likely to assist it in its labours.

Art. 4. A report shall be addressed by the Commission to the National Assembly.

Bradford Union.-Parish of Bradford.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Bradford, in the counties of Wilts and Somerset ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Bradford, in the counties of Wilts and Somerset, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held in the Vestry Room of the Church in the said parish, on Tuesday, the 29th day of November last, in pursuance of notice duly given, it was resolved unanimously-

"That the Poor Law Board be requested to "issue an Order under their seal of office, "directing that the Act passed on the 5th 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. "August, "57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the "'holding of Vestry or other Meetings in " ' Churches, and for regulating the appoint-"' ment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be put in "force within the parish as regards the " whole of its provisions."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to

the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows :-

ARTICLE I.—The whole of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Bradford.

ARTICLE II.- The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of forty pounds per annum, and charge the same to the said parish.

ARTICLE III.-Such salary shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, a proportionate sum being paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

And whereas there are Collectors of the Poor Rates in the said parish duly appointed under Orders of the Poor Law Board in that behalf, but it is nevertheless expedient that the poor rate for the said parish should be made out by the Vestry Clerk.

Now therefore We hereby direct,-

ARTICLE IV .--- The said Vestry Clerk shall, in addition to the duties set forth in the said firstmentioned Act, make out the poor rates for the said parish.

ARTICLE V.—Every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said parish shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the Bradford Union, in the counties of Wilts and Somerset, a bond, in the penal sum of two hundred pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and every such officer shall give imme-diate notice to the said Guardians of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die or become bankrupt or insolvent :

Provided that the Guardians may, if they think fit, take the security of any Society or Company expressly authorized by statute to guarantee or secure the faithful discharge of the duties of any Poor Law Officer, or the guarantee of any Company which shall have complied with the conditions contained in "The Guarantee by Companies Act, 1867," and shall have received from the Treasury a Certificate as therein provided, and shall give their guarantee in a security, the form whereof shall have been approved by the Poor Law Board under their Seal.

ARTICLE VI .- The Auditor of the District comprising the said Union shall, in the statement which he may be required by any General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners or this Board to transmit to the Poor Law Board, of the securities of the officers of the said Union, include the name of the Vestry Clerk for the said parish for the time being appointed under the authority hereof (together with the particulars in such General Order required), and shall report thereon to the Board of Guardians of the said Union, in like manner as therein set forth with reference to the securities of other officers.

ARTICLE VII.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
