PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no

presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves. at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. WHEREAS a Petition was duly presented to one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, under the provisions of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867, signed by ratepayers of parts of the parish of St. Helen's, in the 1sle of Wight, not included in the District of the Ryde Local Board of Health, praying for the settlement of the boundaries of Special Drainage Districts for the purposes of the Acts aforesaid :

And whereas, in pursuance of such Acts, and of the said Petition, inquiry was made into the circumstances of the case, and report was made thereon by Arnold Taylor, Esq., the Inspector appointed for such purpose:

And whereas the said circumstances and Report having been taken into consideration, the then Secretary of State, under the authority conferred on him by the aforesaid Acts, did by his Order dated the 15th day of January, 1868, published in the London Gazette, order and direct that from and after the date thereof, all that part of the parish of Saint Helen's, in the Isle of Wight, which is not under the jurisdiction or within the District of the Ryde Local Board of Health, should be divided for the purposes of such Acts into four Special Drainage Districts, to be styled, respectively,-The Special Drainage District of St. John's, The Special Drainage District of Spring Vale, The Special Drainage District of Sea View, and The Special Drainage District of St. Helen's, and that the boundaries of such districts should be as thereinafter described.

And whereas a Petition has been presented to me by the Committee of the Special Drainage

daries of such Special Drainage District were not correctly described in the aforesaid Order of the then Secretary of State :

Now, therefore, I, having taking the said Petition into consideration, do hereby order and direct that the description of the boundaries in the aforesaid Order shall be amended, and shall be as follows, viz. :-

No. 1. The Special Drainage District of St. John's shall consist of so much of the parish of St. Helen's as is not within the district of the Ryde Local Board of Health, and lies on the west side of a road or lane leading from a point on the sea shore at the north-east corner of the Apley estate, and on the boundary line of the District of the Ryde Local Board of. Health to the high road between Ryde and St. Helen's, continuing after crossing such last-named high road in a southerly direction on the west side of the high road leading to Brading, as far as the boundary line dividing the parish of Brading, from the parish of St. Helen's.

No. 2. The Spring Vale Special Drainage District shall consist of all that part of the parish of St. Helen's, which lies to the eastward of the easterly boundary line of the St. John's Special Drainage District, and westward of a line commencing on the sea shore at the Saltern Marsh Sluice, and passing thence, southerly, along and excluding the trench which runs on the east side of the properties numbered 284, 285, 286, 289, 297, 353, across 326, and on the east side of 321, 325, 324, and across 327, on the tithe map of St. Helen's Parish, until such trench reaches the boundary line which separates the parish of St. Helen's from the parish of Brading, at the south side of such last-named property, such Special Drainage District of Spring Vale being bounded on the north by the sea, and on the south by the parish of Brading.

No. 3. The Sea View Special Drainage District shall consist of all that part of St. Helen's parish which lies to the eastward of the easterly boundary line of the Spring Vale Special Drainage District and westward of a line commencing on the sea shore at a point where the watercourse divides the Priory and the Sea Grove Estates, and passing thence, southerly along and including such watercourse to the north-west corner of the property numbered 467, on the tithe map of St. Helen's parish, and thence southwardly along the western boundary fences of such last-numbered property, and of the property numbered 468, on such tithe map to a point opposite the south corner of St. Helen's Churchyard, and thence southwardly, including such churchyard to the boundary line which separates the parish of St. Helen's from the parish of Brading, such Special Drainage District of Sea View being bounded on the north by the sea, and on the south by the parish of Brading.

No. 4. The St. Helen's Special Drainage District shall consist of the remainder of the parish of St. Helen's which has not been otherwise set out and described.
