West London Tramways.

Tramways Provisional Orders Confirmation Bill.
Power to the West London Tramways Company to extend the Tramway in Fulham-road, authorised by the West London Tramways Provisional Order of the present session, about 18½ chains in length along the same road, so as to form a junction with the South-Western Suburban Tramways authorised by another Provisional Order of the present session.
