NOTIFICATION.

WHEREAS there was concluded between Her Majesty and the United States of America, on the 8th day of May, 1871, a Treaty, of which the following Articles, providing for the settlement of outstanding claims therein described, by means of a Mixed Commission, form part:—

ARTICLE XII.

The High Contracting Parties agree that all claims on the part of Corporations, Companies, or private individuals, citizens of the United States, upon the Government of Her Britannic Majesty, arising out of acts committed against the persons or property of citizens of the United States, during the period between the 13th of April, 1861, and the 9th of April, 1865, inclusive, not being claims growing out of the acts of the vessels referred to in Article I of this Treaty; and all claims, with the like exception, on the part of Corporations, Companies, or private individuals, subjects of Her Britannic Majesty, upon the Government of the United States, arising out of acts committed against the persons or property of subjects of Her Britannic Majesty during the same period, which may have been presented to either Government for its interposition with the other, and which yet remain unsettled, as well as any other such claims which may be presented within the time specified in Article XIV of this Treaty, shall be referred to three Commissioners, to be appointed in the following manner, that is to say:—One Commissioner shall be named by Her Britannic Majesty, one by the President of the United States, and a third by Her Britannic Majesty and the President of the United States conjointly; and in case the third Commissioner shall not have been so named within a period of three months from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of this Treaty, then the third Commissioner shall be named by the Representative at Washington of His Majesty the King of Spain.

In case of the death, absence, or incapacity of any Commissioner, or in the event of any Commissioner omitting or ceasing to act, the vacancy shall be filled in the manner hereinbefore provided for making the original appointment, the period of three months in case of such substitution being calculated from the date of the happening of the vacancy.

The Commissioners so named, shall meet at Washington at the earliest convenient period after they have been respectively named; and shall, before proceeding to any business, make and subscribe a solemn declaration that they will impartially and carefully examine and decide, to the best of their judgment, and according to justice and equity, all such claims as shall be laid before them on the part of the Governments of Her Britannic Majesty, and of the United States, respectively; and such declaration shall be entered on the record of their proceedings.

ARTICLE XIII.

The Commissioners shall then forthwith proceed to the investigation of the claims which shall be presented to them. They shall investigate and decide such claims in such order and such manner as they may think proper, but upon such evidence or information only as shall be furnished by or on behalf of the respective Governments. They shall be bound to receive and consider all written documents or statements which may be presented to them by or on behalf of the respective Governments in support of, or in answer to, any claim; and to hear, if required, one person on each side, on behalf of each Government, as Counsel or Agent for such Government, on each and every separate claim. A majority of the Commissioners shall be sufficient for an award in each case. The award shall be given upon each claim in writing, and shall be signed by the Commissioners assenting to it. It shall be competent for each Government to name one person to attend the Commissioners as its Agent to present and support claims on its behalf, and to answer claims made upon it, and to

represent it generally in all matters connected with the investigation and decision thereof.

The High Contracting Parties hereby engage to consider the decision of the Commissioners as absolutely final and conclusive upon each claim decided upon by them, and to give full effect to such decisions without any objection, evasion, or delay whatsoever.

ARTICLE XIV.

Every claim shall be presented to the Commissioners within six months from the day of their first meeting, unless in any case where reasons for delay shall be established to the satisfaction of the Commissioners; and then, and in any such case, the period for presenting the claim may be extended by them to any time not exceeding three months longer.

The Commissioners shall be bound to examine and decide upon every claim within two years from the day of their first meeting. It shall be competent for the Commissioners to decide in each case whether any claim has or has not been duly made, preferred, and laid before them, either wholly or to any and what extent, according to the true intent and meaning of this Treaty.

ARTICLE XV.

All sums of money which may be awarded by the Commissioners on account of any claim shall be paid by the one Government to the other, as the case may be, within twelve months after the date of the final award, without interest, and without any deduction save as specified in Article XVI of this Treaty.

ARTICLE XVI.

The Commissioners shall keep an accurate record, and correct minutes or notes of all their proceedings, with the dates thereof, and may appoint and employ a Secretary, and any other necessary officer or officers, to assist them in the transaction of the business which may come before them.

Each Government shall pay its own Commissioner and Agent or Counsel. All other expenses shall be defrayed by the two Governments in equal moieties.

The whole expenses of the Commission, including contingent expenses, shall be defrayed by a rateable deduction on the amount of the sums awarded by the Commissioners; provided always that such deduction shall not exceed the rate of 5 per cent. on the sums so awarded.

ARTICLE XVII.

The High Contracting Parties engage to consider the result of the proceedings of this Commission as a full, perfect, and final settlement of all such claims as are mentioned in Article XII of this Treaty upon either Government; and further engage that every such claim, whether or not the same may have been presented to the notice of, made, preferred, or laid before the said Commission, shall, from and after the conclusion of the proceedings of the said Commission, be considered and treated as finally settled, barred, and thenceforth inadmissible.

And whereas the Ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at London on the 17th instant:

And whereas Commissioners on the part of Her Majesty and of the United States of America

will shortly be named, and will meet at Washington for the purpose of carrying out the above-recited stipulations of such Treaty:

Notice is hereby given, that all persons, subjects of Her Majesty, who may have claims of the nature described in the said Articles to prefer upon the Government of the United States, must, in conformity with the provisions of the said Treaty, transmit to such person as may be appointed to receive the same on behalf of Her Majesty's Government, within six months from the day of the first meeting of the Commissioners, the particulars of their claims, together with the requisite evidence or information in support thereof, for the purpose of being submitted to the Commissioners.

Notice will hereafter be given of the appointment of the person to receive the said claims on behalf of Her Majesty's Government, and of the day of the first meeting of the Commissioners.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. Foreign animals shall not be landed at any place in Great Britain except the ports comprised in the Schedule to this Order.

3. Foreign animals landed at any such port shall be landed in such manner, within such times, and subject to such supervision and control, as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs from time to time direct.

HOLBIEN EXHIBITION AT DRESDEN IN 1871.

THE Lords of the Committee of Council for Education have received from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a communication, stating that it is proposed to hold at Dresden, from the 15th August to the 15th October next, the Exhibition of Works by Holbein which was announced last year, but postponed in consequence of the war on the continent.

The following Programme has been issued for the guidance of intending contributors:—

1. The object of the Holbein Exhibition is to bring before the public a collection of the original works of

Hans Holbien the Younger,

and to make it as complete as possible. Works of other artists of the Holbein family, or copies of such works, will be admitted in addition. The Committee charged with the organization of the Exhibition reserves the right to reject works not qualified for the Exhibition.

2. The Exhibition is to continue open from August 15th to October 15th of this year, in the North-Western "Zwinger-Pavillon," belonging to the Royal Picture Gallery at Dresden.

3. It is requested that the announcements of Art works intended for transmission may be made not later than July 15th; and printed forms for this purpose may be obtained from all members of the Committee, or from the Secretary, at the following address:—

It is further requested that the Art works them-

selves may be sent in by August 1st at the latest, addressed as follows:—

4. The Committee will bear the expenses of the transport of works to and from Dresden, including the insurance during transport, according to the value stated by the owners. With regard to the sending of works by express or by post [and not at ordinary rates of freight], a special agreement will be necessary.

5. The cases will be examined by a Commission of Experts when they are opened as well as when they are closed, previous to being sent back, and a note will be made of the contents. The Committee will undertake the careful repacking, free of expense, of the Art Works, when it is necessary to return them. It will be optional with the owners to be themselves present at the unpacking or repacking, or to appoint representatives. The Committee cannot make itself responsible for any damages during transport, and only undertakes the insurance on the value of the works.

6. The Art Works will be returned immediately after the close of the Exhibition according to the directions of the owners.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, inclosing a Report from Her Majesty's Consul in that city relative to a case in which certain English artizans have been dependent for their support upon the charity of the British Community at St. Petersburg, owing to their discharge from the service of a Russian manufacturer, into whose employment they had been tempted by the promise of high wages.

From these documents and also from a report by Her Majesty's Consul at Nicolaieff, on the purchase power of money among the industrial classes in Russia, their Lordships gather that the case referred to is by no means an exceptional one, and that after the English artizan has instructed the native workman in the exercise of his craft, a pretext for his dismissal is too often sought. The legal procedure of the country is too costly and too lengthy to permit him to vindicate his rights in the law courts, and he is thus left without the means either of obtaining employment or returning to his own country.

Their Lordships therefore think it well to warn English artizans of the risks they incur by accepting the apparently advantageous offers of employment in Russia made from time to time in this country.

Spanish Government to the Administrators of Customs in Spanish Ports:—

(Translation.)

For the purpose of avoiding giving rise to international reclamations, you are desired, whenever it is necessary to make the Custom's search on board of foreign vessels, to give notice to the Consul or Vice-Consul of the nation to which she belongs, fixing an hour for making the search, on the expiration of which, without that functionary having made his appearance, the search shall be made, and the fact of the absence of the Consul or Vice-Consul shall be noted briefly and attached to the manifest of the ship in question.

SCHOOL OF NAVAL ARCHITECTURE, &c.

Admiralty, June 20, 1871.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby give notice, that the arrangements for the admission of persons, not already in the Government service, to the Royal School of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering, as Admiralty Pupils, will, for the present year, be as follows:—

Candidates must not be less than 18 or more than 21 years of age, and must have served at least two years in private shipbuilding or engineering establishments, or must give satisfactory proof that they have in some way been so connected with shipbuilding or engineering operations

as to become well-grounded in the elementary principles and practice thereof.

The pupils will be selected by competitive examination, the subjects for which, and numbers of marks assigned for each, are as follows:—

No candidate will be admitted who does not obtain at least two-thirds of the full number of marks in the two first-named subjects, and three-fifths of the full number, either for practical shipbuilding or marine engineering.

The last four subjects, although counting in the competition, will not be considered obligatory.

The candidates who may be selected will be treated, while attached to the school, in all respects as the Admiralty pupils; they will receive wages the same as dockyard apprentices, commencing at 1s. 6d. per day for six days per week for first year, and increasing yearly 3d. per day till it reaches 2s. per day; and in addition a subsistence allowance of 3s. per day for seven days per week while away from their homes, either at the school or in the dockyards.

Seven months of each year—viz., from October till May—will be devoted to study at the school, and the remaining five months to actual work and the acquirement of practical knowledge in the dockyards.

It is to be understood that the Admiralty make no engagement to employ these pupils after the completion of their course of study; and they must rely on their own worth, as educated naval archi-

itects, for obtaining employment in their subsequent career.

The number of such pupils to be selected this year is one shipwright and one engineer.

Persons desirous of competing must forward their names, with a certificate of birth, and on the grounds on which they consider themselves practically qualified, enclosing proper certificates to that effect to the Secretary of the Admiralty, not later than the 11th July.

The candidates should also state whether they wish to be examined as engineers or shipwrights.

The examination will take place on the 18th July and three following days.
