THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Charleston, enclosing a copy of a Notice of the Health Officer at that port extending the quaran-

tine law of the State of South Carolina along the coast to the south boundary of St. Helena Sound, and the Bull, Coosaw, Combahee, and Ashepoo Rivers, emptying into the said St. Helena Sound. By the above-mentioned law vessels arriving from infected ports are detained thirty days, while those bringing clean bills of health from United States Consuls are detained only so long as may seem necessary to the health officer.
