THE Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, hath been graciously pleased, by Letters Patent under Her Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to Installation, and to grant unto His Majesty Pedro II., Emperor of Brazil, Knight of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if His Imperial Majesty had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note from the Turkish Ambassador at this Court, enclosing a copy of the Report of the Commission appointed to revise the Sanitary Dues Tariff of Turkey, together with a copy of the Tariff drawn up by them, of which the following is a translation.

This Tariff came into force on the 13th June last.

TARIFF OF SANITARY DUES IN THE TURKISH EMPIRE.

ART. 1.

The Tariff of Sanitary Dues comprises:—

1. A tonnage duty (*droit de reconnaissance*) payable by vessels entering Turkish ports.
2. Quarantine charges in lieu thereof (*en cas de contumace*).
3. In addition to the foregoing, a tax on pilgrims and travellers coming overland from Persia.

ART. 2.—Duties on Arrival

Vessels from any country, arriving in a Turkish port will pay a duty (*droit de reconnaissance*), calculated on their tonnage, in accordance with the following scale:—

From 1 to 500 tons inclusive, 22 paras the ton; from 500 tons and upwards, 12 paras the ton;— that is to say, every vessel shall pay 22 paras on the first 500 "tons measurement" (*tonneaux de jauge*), and 12 paras for every additional ton.

ART. 3.

Vessels entering Turkish Ports are liable to the duty mentioned in the preceding Article only once in the course of each voyage, and without counting intermediate stoppages.

ART. 4.

Pilgrims and travellers coming overland from Persia shall pay a duty of 10 piastres each person, exclusive of the quarantine charges specified in the following Article.

A duty of 50 piastres shall be levied on every corpse brought overland into the *vilayet* of Bagdad for interment in places resorted to by Persian pilgrims.

ART. 6.

Children under seven years of age and paupers are exempted from lazaretto charges.

ART. 7.

The following vessels are exempt from all the sanitary dues fixed by the foregoing Articles, fees to Health Officers and porters excepted:—(1) Men of war; (2) Ships driven into port in distress, provided they do not engage in any commercial transaction in the port into which they are driven; (3) Fishing-vessels.

ART. 8.

Patent and *visa* dues (*droits de patente et de visa*) as well as all other previously existing dues, not enumerated in the present tariff, are abolished.

SUPPLEMENTARY ARTICLE.

The sanitary tax is to be paid in all ports of the Empire in coin of the realm.

N.B.—It is expressly understood (1) that the tonnage, according to the tariff, is that known as "Register tonnage" (*Tonnage commercial*); (2) That an English ton is equal to 40 Turkish kilos; (3) That from the tonnage of steamers, the "Register tonnage" (*Tonnage commercial*) of which is not officially stated, a deduction of 40 per cent. must be made [from the gross tonnage] for engine room, coal bunkers, &c.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Royal Spanish Decree, dated the 28th ultimo, relating to the Customs' duties on foreign goods arriving under Spanish flag at the Philippine Islands:—

Art. 1. Foreign merchandize, produce, and effects brought from foreign ports in Spanish bottoms are not to be regarded as appertaining to the coasting trade in the Philippine Isles, even though they may have touched, in transit, at ports of the Peninsula, adjacent islands, and Spanish Antilles, and left with the same cargo.

Art. 2. The said manufactures, produce, and effects, brought from foreign ports under Spanish flag, will pay the Customs' dues with the following reductions:—

25 per cent. on importations from July 1st, 1871, till June 30, 1873;
20 per cent. on importations from July 1st, 1873, till June 30, 1875;
15 per cent. on importations from July 1st, 1875, till June 30, 1877;
10 per cent. on importations from 1st July, 1877 till June 30, 1879,
on which day this privilege will cease.

Art. 3. The Government will report to the Cortes on the dispositions on Art. 2 of the present Decree.

Whereas at the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, holden at Saint Augustine's, near Canterbury, in and for the county of Kent, on Tuesday, the 4th day of April, 1871, a Provisional Order was made in the words following, that is to say:—

At the General Quarter Session of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden at Saint Augustine's, near Canterbury, in and for the county of Kent, on Tuesday in the week next after the 31st day of March, to wit, the 4th day of April, 1871, and in the thirty-fourth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, before Edward Hugessen Knatchbull - Hugessen, Esquire, M.P., the Reverend George Wilson Sicklemore, Peter Marten, Esquire, and others their fellows Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to preserve the Peace of our said Lady the Queen in the said county, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdemeanors done and committed therein.

Whereas pursuant to a requisition under the hands of five Justices of the Peace in and for the county of Kent, the Clerk of the Peace of the said county added to, and sent with, the notice required by law to be given for the holding of the present Quarter Sessions of the Peace for this county, a notice, as near as circumstances would admit, in the form marked A in the schedule of the statute 25 and 26 Vict., c. 61, that at the Court therein mentioned, a proposal would be made to the Justices in such Court of Quarter Sessions assembled, to alter the New Romney Highway District, in the said county, which had been formed under the said Act, in the manner hereinbelow ordered.

It is provisionally ordered, on the application of the parish of West Hythe, in the said county, and with the consent of the inhabitants of the said parish in vestry assembled, and of the Town Council of the borough of Hythe, in the said county, in which borough the part of the said parish hereinafter mentioned is situate, that the said New Romney Highway District be altered by adding thereto that part of the said parish of West Hythe which is within the limits of the said borough of Hythe, and is not now included in the said highway district.

And this Court doth appoint the next Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden at Saint Augustine's, near Canterbury, in

and for the said county of Kent, on the 27th day of June next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the taking into consideration the confirmation of this Provisional Order by a Final Order.

And whereas such Provisional Order hereinbefore recited has been duly published in two newspapers circulating in the district of the said county affected by the said Order, and a copy of such Order has been sent in a prepaid letter to the Overseers of the said parish of West Hythe, and of every parish within the Highway District proposed to be altered, and there was added to the Notice of the said Provisional Order a Notice of the date of the Session at which the confirmation of such Provisional Order would be considered.
