THIS day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of ten million pounds out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of

the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

An Act for raising the sum of seven hundred thousand pounds by exchequer bonds, for the service of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

An Act to repeal an Act for preventing the assumption of certain ecclesiastical titles in respect of places in the United Kingdom.

An Act to settle a boundary within which a vote may be taken for the adoption of the Local Government Act by the district of Kingsholm, in the county of Gloucester.

An Act to provide further protection against dogs.

An Act to amend the Law relating to criminal and dangerous lunatics in Scotland.

An Act to enable the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings to acquire additional Lands for improving the site of the Courts of Justice and the various offices belonging to the same.
