BY THE LORD CHANCELLOR.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of "The Courts of Justice (Salaries and Funds) Act, 1869," it is provided that the Lord Chancellor, with the advice and consent of the Lords Justices of Appeal, Master of the Rolls, and Vice-Chancellors, or any three of them, and with the concurrence of the Treasury, may from time to time by Order increase, reduce, or abolish all or any of the existing fees, and appoint new fees to be taken in relation to proceedings in the Court of Chancery or in any of the Offices mentioned in the third schedule to the same Act: and whereas the office of the Lord Chancellor's Secretary of Presentations is one of the offices mentioned in the said schedule, and it is expedient to appoint new fees to be taken therein in lieu of the fees now taken: Now, thereupon, I, the Right Honorable William Page, Baron Hatherley, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, with the advice and consent of the Right Honorable John, Lord Romilly, Master of the Rolls, and the Right Honourable Sir William Milbourne James, Knight, and the Right Honorable Sir George Mellish, Knight, Lords Justices of the Court of Appeal in Chancery, and with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order and appoint that from and after the 1st day of August, 1871, there shall be taken in the office of the Lord Chancellor's Secretary of Presentations, in lieu of the fees now taken therein, the fees mentioned in the schedule hereto, in respect of the matters and things specified in the same schedule, and that from and after the said 1st day of August, all such fees be taken by means of Stamps.
