

of permanent residence without being subject to the payment of any duties beyond those corresponding to the annual permit.

ART. VIII. All travellers entering the Kingdom in transit for the purpose of quitting the same through any point on the frontier or through any sea port are dispensed from taking out a permit of residence, provided their stay in the Kingdom shall not exceed 8 days.

§ 1. The dispensation from taking out a permit of residence does not exempt one from appearing before the respective Administrative Authority within the period specified in the 2nd Article, in which case the traveller must declare how long he will stay in the Kingdom, and provide himself with a passport for the place to which he intends to proceed.

§ 2. Should a traveller exhibit a passport from the place whence he came his departure from the Kingdom shall be allowed by means of a visa written out on the passport itself.

§ 3. When a traveller has to quit within 48 hours, the visas mentioned in the foregoing paragraph may be signed by the Police functionaries who control the entrance of travellers, after obtaining the authorization of the respective Civil Governors.

ART. IX. The stamp duty leviable upon permits of residence and upon visas shall be recovered by means of stamps.

ART. X. All visits and official inspection of the Police are done away with upon the entry of vessels arriving from European ports, with the exception of the delivery of a list (see model No. 3 annexed to the general Police Regulations of April 7, 1863), which the masters of ships are bound to present immediately to the Police Authority under pain of being liable to a fine of from 10,000 to 50,000 reis (£2 4s. 5d. to £11 2s. 2d.).

The rule laid down in this Article does not exclude any extraordinary visits that the Police Authorities may consider it expedient to make in the interest of the public service.

ART. XI. The visits and official inspection of the Police are also done away with upon the

departure of any vessels bound to any ports of the Kingdom or of the adjacent Islands.

ART. XII. The Police delegations in the Ports of Lisbon and Oporto are abolished.

§ 1. The employes of these delegations which are hereby abolished shall be attached to the respective offices of the Civil Governments as provided in the Law of July 13, 1863, in order that they may in due time be placed on the list of employes of the said offices, of the Civil Government, or of other public departments, in accordance with the Decree of October 31, 1870.

§ 2. The boatman belonging to the boat made use of by the maritime Police delegation of Oporto for visiting the ships shall be attached to the Custom-house of that city.

§ 3. The Police visits to ships shall in future be made in boats furnished by the Custom-houses.

ART. XIII. The duties which were hitherto entrusted to the delegations now abolished shall be discharged by the respective Civil Governments.

§ 1. The Civil Government of Lisbon and Oporto shall select from among the employes of the Civil Governments or from the Public Departments subject to them, those who are to be entrusted with the duty of visiting the ships.

§ 2. The employes appointed for this service shall perform the same duties and functions as were discharged by the delegates of maritime Police in virtue of the regulations.

ART. XIV. The Government shall embody into one Code of Regulations all the enactments concerning the supervision exercised by the Police over travellers.

The President of the Council of Ministers, Minister and Secretary of State for the Home Department, and the Minister and Secretary of State for the Finance Department shall accordingly cause the same to be carried into execution.
