a copy of a Decree of the German Emperor pro-  
viding for the introduction into Alsace and  
Lorraine on the 1st January, 1872, of Article 33

of the Constitution of the German Empire which  
runs as follows:—

“Germany forms a Customs and Commercial  
Territory surrounded by a common frontier of  
Customs. Those separate portions of territory  
which on account of their situation are not adapted  
to being included within the line of Custom-houses  
are excepted.

“All commodities which are objects of free  
traffic in one State of the Confederation can be  
introduced into any other State of the Confedera-  
tion, and may be subjected to a duty in the latter  
State only in so far as similar inland products are  
subject to an inland duty in that State.”

With regard to particular Articles it is pro-  
vided that the instructions in the second paragraph  
of the preceding Article can be put into operation  
by Imperial Order previous to the 1st of January,  
1872, either with or without restrictions.

*Fixed Light on Awadji Island, North Point.*

INFORMATION has been received from the Japanese Government, that a light has been placed at Matsu-wo-no-hana, the north point of Awadji Island, Akasi Strait.

The light is a *fixed* light of the first order, 158 feet above the sea, illuminating an arc from seaward between the bearings of west round southward to N.E. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E., and in clear weather can be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

The tower is built of stone, 15 feet high ; position, lat.  $34^{\circ} 36' 40''$  N., long.  $135^{\circ} 0' 30''$  E.

## GULF OF OSAKA.

*Fixed Light on Wada Misaki, Hiogo.*

Also, that a temporary light, until the completion of the permanent apparatus, has been placed on Wada Misaki, to the south-west of Kobe anchorage.

The light is a *fixed red* light, 52 feet above the sea, and in clear weather can be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The tower is an octagonal-shaped white wooden

building, 46 feet high ; position, lat.  $34^{\circ} 39' 30''$  N., long.  $135^{\circ} 12' E.$

*Fixed Light on Temposan Fort, Oösaka.*

Also, that a temporary light, until the completion of the permanent apparatus, has been placed in Temposan Fort, at the mouth of the Agi Kawa.

The light is a *fixed* light, 53 feet above the sea, and in clear weather can be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The tower is a square-shaped white wooden building, 30 feet high ; position, lat.  $34^{\circ} 39' 45''$  N., long.  $135^{\circ} 26' 35'' E.$

**COTTON STATISTICS' ACT, 1868.**
