THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, reporting that an Industrial and Fine

Arts Exhibition is to be held in that city in 1872. This Exhibition is to be confined almost exclusively to exhibitors who are natives of Sweden, Norway, and Denmark. Foreigners are permitted, however, to exhibit the following industrial products:—

- (1.) Machinery and implements of recent invention, more especially such as may be considered to have some important bearing on the industry of the three Northern Kingdoms.
- (2.) Manufactured articles and products of new descriptions, or produced by a new method.
- (3.) Manufactured articles and products which have not been hitherto produced in the three Northern Kingdoms.

Foreign exhibitors taking advantage of the above permission will have to conform to the rules and regulations issued by the Committee, who shall have the right of deciding whether such foreign articles can be exhibited in the Exhibition building itself, or whether the exhibitors themselves shall be called upon at their own expense to provide the necessary show-rooms.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Malaga, reporting that that port is not qualified for the performance of quarantine of any kind; that vessels arriving there from ports reputed as fowl are immediately sent away to a fowl lazaret at Vigo, Tambo, or Port Mahon, and that vessels coming from suspected ports are dismissed to one of the neighbouring observation lazarets of Almeria or Cadiz.

Her Majesty's Consul at Malaga recommends that masters of vessels coming to that port from Great Britain, Northern Europe, or America, should touch at Vigo or Tambo, and those from the Upper Mediterranean and Levant, should call at Port Mahon, at which lazarets they can either obtain free pratique, if entitled thereto, or perform the necessary quarantine, and thus avoid the delay and other inconveniences which would arise from their almost certain dismissal from the port of Malaga, in case they made their voyage to that place direct.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the undersigned, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Post Office Acts and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, order and direct as follows:—

1. The letters described or referred to in the Schedule hereto may be transmitted by the post from the countries and places set forth in the first column to the countries and places set forth in the second column of such schedule, by the routes and means of conveyance described and set forth in the third column of such schedule, at the rates of postage respectively specified in the fourth column of such schedule, and subject to

the regulations and conditions hereinafter contained.

2. In charging any partly prepaid letter posted in the United Kingdom, or posted in Sweden addressed to the United Kingdom, with the postage chargeable thereon under this Warrant, credit shall be given for any postage already paid.

3. Registered letters may be transmitted upon payment of such additional charges or rates of postage or otherwise as the Postmaster-General from time to time directs or appoints: provided that all rates of postage and additional charges or rates payable thereupon shall be prepaid, and that no payment shall be made thereupon on delivery.

4. This Warrant shall not prejudice or affect any exemptions or privileges granted by the Post Office Acts, nor the privilege enjoyed by seamen, soldiers, and others employed in Her Majesty's Service, of sending and receiving letters at a reduced rate of postage.

5. The rates of postage fixed by this Warrant on letters transmitted by the post as herein-mentioned shall be in lieu of those now chargeable thereon by virtue of a certain Treasury Warrant dated the 21st day of May, 1866, which Treasury Warrant is hereby repealed, but so, nevertheless, as not to revive any Treasury Warrant or part of a Treasury Warrant which has been heretofore repealed.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

BURY SAINT EDMUND'S FAIRS, SUFFOLK.
