(No. 72.)—GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE—ANTICOSTI ISLAND.

Flashing Light on South Point.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Bagot's Bluff, three-quarters of a mile from the south point of Anticosti Island.

The light is a *flashing* white light, showing a flash *every twenty seconds*, elevated 75 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower, a white wooden building, is hexagon shaped and 50 feet high. Position, lat. 49° 4' N., long. 62° 15' W.

Steam Fog Whistle at South Point Lighthouse.

Also, that a steam fog whistle has been placed 100 yards east of the lighthouse, on South Point, Anticosti Island, and in thick or foggy weather it will be sounded for *ten seconds* in *every minute*, thus making an interval of 50 seconds between each blast.

In calm weather the whistle would probably be heard 15 miles.

NEW BRUNSWICK—NORTH COAST.

Revolving Light on Cape Magdalen.

Also, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Magdalen, in the Gulf of St. Lawrence.

The light is a *revolving* light, showing *red and white* at intervals of *two minutes*; it is elevated 147 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather the red light should be seen from a distance of 15 miles, and the white light 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower, a white wooden building, is 54 feet high. Position, lat. 49° 15' 40" N., long. 65° 19' 30" W.

Flashing Light on Cape Chatte.

Also, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse on the north-west point of Cape Chatte, in the Gulf of St. Lawrence.

The light is a *flashing* white light, showing a flash *every thirty seconds*, it is elevated 110 feet above the high water level, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower, a square wooden building 37 feet high, is painted white, and is attached to the keeper's dwelling. Position, lat. 49° 5' 50" N., long. 66° 45' 50" W.

Alteration in Fog Signal on St. Paul's Island.

Also, that from the 1st day of December, 1871, the fog bell at the south-west lighthouse on St. Paul's Island at the entrance of the Gulf, will be discontinued, and in the early part of next season a steam fog whistle will be substituted for it; until the whistle is ready a gun will be fired at the main station on the east side of the island, in thick or foggy weather, during the season of navigation, every hour instead of every 4 hours as heretofore.

UNITED STATES—MASSACHUSETTS—PLYMOUTH.

Fixed Light near Duxbury Pier.

The United States Government has given notice, that from the 15th day of September, 1871, a light would be exhibited from a tower recently erected near Duxbury Pier, Plymouth Harbour, Cape Cod Bay.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 34 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

The tower is built of iron and painted red, it stands in one foot water at low water springs.
