WHEREAS the School Board of Manchester, appointed under "The Elementary Education Act, 1870," have, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the seventy-fourth section of that Act, with the approval of the Education Department, made certain Bye-laws, bearing date the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, numbered 17.

And whereas all the conditions in regard to the said Bye-laws, which are required to be fulfilled by the said Act, have been fulfilled, and the said Bye-laws have been submitted for the sanction of Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said Bye-laws (copy whereof is hereunto annexed) into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare, and doth hereby declare, Her sanction of the same.

## THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ACT, 1870.

## BYE-LAWS OF THE CITY OF MANCHESTER SCHOOL BOARD.

WHEREAS, by the 74th section of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, it is enacted, that every School Board may, from time to time, with the approval of the Education Department, make

Bye-laws for all or any of the following purposes :—

- (a.) Requiring the parents of children of such age, not less than five years nor more than thirteen years, as may be fixed by the Bye-laws, to cause such children (unless there be some reasonable excuse) to attend school.
- (b.) Determining the time during which children are so to attend school, provided that no such Bye-law shall prevent the withdrawal of any child from any religious observance or instruction in religious subjects, or shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which his parent belongs, or shall be contrary to anything contained in any Act for regulating the education of children employed in labour.
- (c.) Providing for the remission of payment of the whole or any part of the fees of any child, where the parent satisfies the School Board that he is unable from poverty to pay the same.
- (d.) Imposing penalties for the breach of any Bye-laws.
- (e.) Revoking or altering any Bye-laws previously made.

Provided that any Bye-law under this section requiring a child between ten and thirteen years of age to attend school, shall provide for the total or partial exemption of such child from the obligation to attend school, if one of Her Majesty's Inspectors certify that such child has reached a standard of education specified in such Bye-laws.

And by the said 74th section it is further enacted, that any of the following reasons shall be a reasonable excuse, namely :—

- (a.) That the child is under efficient instruction in some other manner.
- (b.) That the child has been prevented from attending school by sickness or any unavoidable cause.
- (c.) That there is no Public Elementary School open which the child can attend within such distance, not exceeding three miles, measured according to the nearest road from the residence of such child, as the Bye-laws may prescribe.

And by the said 74th section it is further enacted, that any proceeding to enforce any Bye-law may be taken, and any penalty for the breach of any Bye-law may be recovered in a summary manner; but no penalty imposed for the breach of any Bye-law shall exceed such amount as with the costs will amount to five shillings for each offence; and such Bye-laws shall not come into operation until they have been sanctioned by Her Majesty in Council.

And whereas, by the 17th section of the said Act it is enacted, that every child attending a school provided by any School Board, shall pay such weekly fee as may be prescribed by the School Board, with the consent of the Education Department; but the School Board may, from time to time, for a renewable period not exceeding six months, remit the whole or any part of such fee in the case of any child when they are of opinion that the parent of such child is unable from poverty to pay the same, but such remission shall not be deemed to be parochial relief given to such parent.

And whereas, by the 25th section of the said Act it is enacted, that the School Board may, if they think fit, from time to time, for a renewable period not exceeding six months, pay the whole

or any part of the school fees payable at any Public Elementary School, by any child resident in their district whose parent is in their opinion unable from poverty to pay the same; but no such payment shall be made or refused on condition of the child attending any Public Elementary School other than such as may be selected by the parent, and such payment shall not be deemed to be parochial relief given to such parent.

And whereas, by the 26th section of the said Act it is enacted, that if a School Board satisfy the Education Department that, on the ground of the poverty of the inhabitants of any place in their district, it is expedient for the interests of education to provide a school at which no fees shall be required from the scholars, the Board may, subject to such rules and conditions as the Education Department may prescribe, provide such school, and may admit scholars to such school without requiring any fee.

And whereas, by the 36th section of the said Act it is enacted, that every School Board may, if they think fit, appoint an officer or officers to enforce any Bye-laws, under this Act, with reference to the attendance of children at school, and to bring before two Justices children who are liable, under the Industrial Schools Act, 1866, to be sent to a certified Industrial School, in order to their being so sent, and any expenses incurred under this section may be paid out of the School Fund.

And whereas, in pursuance of a requisition sent by the Education Department to the Mayor of the city of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, a School Board for the district of the said city was duly elected on the 24th day of November, 1870.

Now, at a meeting of the School Board of the said city of Manchester, held at the Board Room, 28, Cross-street, in the said city of Manchester, on Monday, the 26th day of June, 1871, at which meeting a quorum of the members of such Board are present, the said Board do hereby, in pursuance of the aforesaid powers, and subject to the approval of the Education Department, make and ordain the following Bye-laws :—

#### PRELIMINARY.

In these Bye-laws—

The term "Education Department" means "The Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education."

The term "Her Majesty's Inspectors" means "The Inspectors of Schools appointed by Her Majesty on the recommendation of the Education Department."

The term "City of Manchester" means "The Municipal Borough of Manchester as enlarged and extended by the Act for the regulation of Municipal Corporations in England and Wales," and includes any future enlargement or extension of such municipal borough.

The terms importing *Males* in these Bye-laws include *females*.

The term "School Board" or "Board" means "The School Board of the district comprising the city of Manchester."

The term "School" or "Public Elementary School" means a Public Elementary School as defined by the said Act, and includes a Free School, but not an Industrial School.

The term "Managers" includes all persons who have the management of any Public Elementary School.

The term "Officer" means an officer appointed by the Board, pursuant to the 36th section of the said Act.

The term "Parent" includes guardian, and every person who is liable to maintain or has the actual custody of any child, but does not include the mother of a child when the father is living, and is residing within the city.

#### *Bye-laws.*

1. The parent of every child residing within the Manchester School District shall cause such child, being not less than five, nor more than thirteen years old, to attend a Public Elementary School, unless there be a reasonable excuse for non-attendance.

The following shall be deemed reasonable excuses:—

- (a.) Sickness or some other cause which, in the opinion of the School Board, shall be deemed reasonable.
- (b.) That such child is subject, for the time being, to the provisions of any statutes for regulating the education of children in certain employments.
- (c.) That such child is otherwise under efficient instruction.
- (d.) That such child, having attained the age of ten years, has passed a public examination according to the 4th standard of the Government Code of February, 1871, and has obtained a certificate to that effect from one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.
- (e.) That any such child who has been so certified to have passed a public examination according to the 3rd standard of education mentioned in the said code, shall be exempt from the obligation to attend more than one-half of the meetings of the school in any one week.

2. The time during which every child shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children, provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the withdrawal of any child from any religious observance or instruction in religious subjects, or shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which his parent belongs, or shall be deemed or construed as being contrary to anything contained in any Act for regulating the education of children employed in labour.

3. An officer may visit the parent of any child who, according to his information and belief, is not attending school, or under efficient instruction, and may then, or at a subsequent time, serve upon such parent a notice in the form or to the effect prescribed in the Schedule to these Bye-laws; and unless the parent object, the officer shall read over and explain such notice, and the consequences of neglecting to comply therewith, to the parent at the time of service.

4. The particulars of each notice served upon parents shall be recorded by the officer serving the same, in a book to be provided by the Board, which shall be laid before the Board at each ordinary meeting.

5. An officer shall not disclose the fact of service of any such notice, or any information relating thereto, to any person not a member or officer of the Board, or a manager or principal teacher of a school.

6. No proceeding against any parent for breach of these Bye-laws, or any of them, shall be taken until after the expiration of fourteen days from the service of the notice prescribed by Bye-law No. 3, nor until such parent has had an oppor-

tunity of attending a meeting of the Board, or of a Committee thereof, or of the managers of a school, to state his or her reasons for not complying with the said notice.

7. Every parent who shall neglect or not observe these Bye-laws, or any of them, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding five shillings, including costs, for each offence: Provided always, that no person shall be liable to be convicted more than once in respect of acts of such negligence or non-observance occurring in one and the same week: And provided also, that no proceedings shall be taken against any parent whose child has attended four-fifths of the meetings of the school during the four weeks next preceding the week in which the report is made.

8. Whenever the parent of any child shall satisfy the School Board that he is unable from poverty to pay the school fees for such child, the School Board shall, for a renewable period not exceeding six calendar months, pay such fees to the managers of the school attended or proposed to be attended by such child: Provided that the school fees shall be allowed in the following cases only, excepting under special order of the Board, and that such fees shall not in any case exceed the scale hereinafter mentioned:—

- (a.) Where the family consists of two persons, and the weekly income (after allowing for rent) does not exceed 4s. per head per week;
- (b.) Where the family consists of three or four persons, and the income (after allowing for rent) does not exceed 3s. 6d. per head per week;
- (c.) Where the family consists of five or six persons, and the income (after allowing for rent) does not exceed 3s. per head per week.

#### *Scale of Fees.*

No extra charge is to be made for books or other school requisites, whether for school or home use, by children who are paid for by the Board.

*Note.*—These Bye-laws will come into force immediately after receiving the sanction of Her Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council have by a Licence bearing even date with this Order licensed the Metropolitan Board of Works, as the Local Authority for the Metropolis under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, to hold, under the direction of the Smithfield Club, at the Agricultural Hall, in the parish of Islington, in the Metropolis, on the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth days of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, the Exhibition and Sale of cattle and other animals, commonly known as the Smithfield Club Cattle Show (and in this Order referred to as the Show):

And whereas the Licence provides for the appointment of a Pass-Master of the Show, and of two Veterinary Surgeons for the Show:

And whereas it is necessary that further provision be made for the regulation of the Show:

Now, therefore, the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling

them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. Cattle that have been in the Metropolis for more than seven days before the opening of the Show shall not be admitted thereto, and cattle brought to the Metropolis for the Show shall be taken direct thereto.

3. No cattle shall be admitted to the Show without a Licence for the purpose from the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis or of the City of London.

4. Each animal before admission to the Show shall be examined by the Veterinary Surgeons for the Show, or one of them, and if on such examination any animal is found to be affected with any contagious or infectious disease it shall not be admitted to the Show.

5. If any case of cattle plague occurs in the Show, the Council of the Smithfield Club shall cause all the animals in the Show to be forthwith slaughtered (in pursuance of the condition to that effect contained in the Licence).

6. If any case of foot-and-mouth disease occurs in the Show, the following regulations shall have effect:—

(1.) The animals affected with foot-and-mouth disease shall be slaughtered in the Metropolis, and, for that purpose, shall be moved to a Slaughter-house with a pass of the Pass-Master of the Show:

(2.) The animals not so affected may be moved and dealt with as if a case of foot-and-mouth disease had not occurred in the Show.

7. If any case of contagious or infectious disease other than cattle plague or foot-and-mouth disease occurs in the Show, the animals in the Show shall be liable to be dealt with as if this Order had not been made.

8. If no case of contagious or infectious disease occurs in the Show, cattle exhibited in the Show may be moved, (in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and not otherwise,) as follows:—

(1.) They may be moved out of the Show for slaughter in the Metropolis:

(2.) They may be moved out of the Show, and then alive out of the Metropolis.

9. Cattle moved out of the Show for slaughter in the Metropolis shall be moved only with a pass given by the Pass-Master of the Show to the owner or purchaser desirous of moving the same.

10. All cattle exhibited in the Show and not moved out of the Metropolis shall be slaughtered in the Metropolis on or before the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

11. Cattle moved out of the Show and then out of the Metropolis shall be moved only in manner and subject to the conditions following:—

(1.) There shall be a Licence of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis for the movement:

(2.) Such Licence shall only be granted on a Certificate of Health signed by one of the Veterinary Surgeons for the Show, and a certificate of the Pass-Master of the Show of the cattle having been exhibited in the Show:

- (3.) If the cattle are moved out of the Metropolis by railway, they shall be conveyed in properly constructed cattle-vans, without stopping, to the railway-station, and there be transferred from the vans directly to the railway-truck :
- (4.) If the cattle are moved out of the Metropolis otherwise than by railway, they shall be conveyed, without stopping, from the Show out of the Metropolis in properly constructed cattle-vans :
- (5.) Provided that if any cattle being so moved, while in the Metropolis, come accidentally or otherwise in contact with any cattle not having been exhibited at the Show, they shall not be moved out of the Metropolis, but shall be slaughtered in the Metropolis.
12. If no case of contagious or infectious disease occurs in the Show, animals (other than cattle) exhibited in the Show, may be moved out of the Show and out of the Metropolis as if this Order had not been made.
13. Any dung of animals, and any hay, straw, litter, or other thing commonly used for food of animals, or otherwise for or about animals, shall not be moved out of the Show without a certificate

of one of the Veterinary Surgeons for the Show, certifying that the thing moved has not been in contact with, or been used for or about any animal affected with a contagious or infectious disease, or that it has been properly disinfected.

14. Where the Licence of a Commissioner of Police is required under this Order, the Commissioner is hereby empowered to grant the same, and the Commissioner may at any time, if he thinks fit, revoke any licence granted by him.

15. Licences, certificates, and passes required under this Order shall be in the respective forms given in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

16. This Order shall have full effect notwithstanding anything in The Metropolitan Contagious Diseases (Animals) Order of August, 1869, or in any other Order of the Privy Council.

17. If any person or body does anything in contravention of, or fails to comply with any of the provisions of, this Order, such person or body shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Order.

(Appointment of Stipendiary Magistrate for the Petty Sessional Division of Pontypridd; Application and Increase of existing Rates; New or Additional Rates.)

APPLICATION is intended to be made to Parliament next session, for an Act to effect the objects, or some of the objects, following; viz. :—

1. **Bristol Tramways.**

(Power to the Corporation of Bristol to construct Tramways from Castle-street to Lawrence-hill, and from Saint Augustine's-place to the Black Boy Inn, all in the City of Bristol.)

1. **T**HE Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the city of Bristol (who are hereinafter called "The Corporation") intend to apply to

the Board of Trade for a Provisional Order, authorising the construction and maintenance of the several street tramways hereinafter described (to be worked by animal power only), or of some of those street tramways, with all necessary and proper rails, plates, sleepers, works, and conveniences. The said tramways will be entirely within the city of Bristol.

2. Where, in the description of any of the proposed tramways, any distance is given with reference to any street which intersects or joins the streets in which the tramway is to be laid, the distance is to be taken as measured from the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets and continued would intersect each other, and a point described as being opposite a street is to be taken, unless otherwise stated, as opposite the centre of the street.

3. Each tramway described in this Notice is intended to consist of a single pair of rails of the gauge of four feet eight inches and a-half, and is to be laid, unless otherwise specified, along the centre of the street, by which it is meant that the imaginary centre line between the two rails of the tramway is to coincide as nearly as possible with the imaginary centre line of the street.
