To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Great Malvern, in the County of Worcester ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

HEREAS the population of the parish of Great Malvern, in the county of Worcester, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held in the Vestry Room of the Priory Church, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 5th day of October last, it was resolved,-

"That the Local Government Board be re-"the 14th year of the reign of Her present "Majesty (18 and 14 Vict., cap. 57),

"quested to issue an Order under their seal " of office, directing that the Act passed in

" intituled 'An Act to prevent the holding of " 'Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, "'and for regulating the Appointment of "' Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force in this parish with regard to "that portion of it only which relates to the

ARTICLE I.—So much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and put in force within the said parish of Great Malvern.

ARTICLE II.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall, unless the Local Government Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of Vestry Clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the statutes in such behalf and of this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of seventy pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—The salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Lady-day, Midaummer-day, Michaelmasday, and Christmas-day, a proportionate sum being paid to his executors or administrators in case he shall die while holding such office.
