Those for consumption on the Isthmus, as well as those for the Colombian Pacific Ports of Buenaventura and Tumaco, are to be paid for as heretofore.

THE Board of Trade have received a Dispatch from Her Majesty's Consul General at Constantinople, stating that the Ottoman Government has declared free the passage of the Straits of the Dardanelles and Bosphorus, from the 13th December, 1871. The following Notice to Shipmasters embodying the necessary information has been issued by the Consul-General:—

*British Consulate-General, Constantinople,  
December 12, 1871.*

ALL vessels may henceforth pass through the Straits of the Bosphorus and Dardanelles at any hour of the day or night.

To prevent vessels stopping to get their Firmans at Constantinople on their passage down from the Black Sea to the Mediterranean, Shipmasters may provide themselves on their arrival from the Mediterranean, with the two necessary Firmans, i.e., the one for the Bosphorus and the one for the Dardanelles.

These Firmans must henceforth be delivered by vessels sailing for the Mediterranean on board a Ship of War stationed at Galata Point, opposite Gallipoli.

In order that Shipmasters may avail themselves of the privilege of not being delayed on their passage home, they must take not only their Bosphorus and Dardanelles Firmans at the same time, but must then pay all necessary dues and fees and take their receipts at Constantinople previous to their passing up to the Black Sea.

In this way they will avoid the necessity of stopping at the Bosphorus on their return from the Black Sea, except at Cavak or Buyukdere to take pratique.

IN THE MATTER OF THE FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1871.

WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the nature of the business of the Trades carried on in Factories and Workshops, specified in the Schedule hereto, depends upon the weather and the seasons of the year, and requires that young persons of at least fourteen years of age and upwards, and women working in such Factories and Workshops, should be employed in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now I, the said Henry Austin Bruce, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the 1st and 2nd Articles of the Schedule annexed to the Factory and Workshop Act, 1871, do, by this my Order, give permission to occupiers of the said Factories and Workshops to employ young persons of at least fourteen years of age, and women, working in such Factories and Workshops, for a period not exceeding fourteen hours in any one day:

Provided that:—

1st. They shall not be so employed except between the hours of six in the morning and eight in the evening, or where permission has been given by the Secretary of State to work between the hours of seven in the morning and seven in the evening, or of eight in the morning and eight in the evening; then, except between the hours of seven in the morning and nine in the evening, or eight in the morning and ten in the evening, as the case may be:

2nd. In addition to the time allowed for meals, they shall be allowed half-an-hour for a meal after the hour of five in the evening:

3rd. They shall not be so employed for more than ninety-six days in any period of twelve months, or for more than five consecutive days in any one week:

4th. They are not so employed at any one time for more than one month from the date of a Notice signed by the Inspector of Factories for the district, and hung up in the Factory or Workshop.

REGULATIONS respecting Temporary Messengers in Government Departments.

1. A list of persons eligible for occasional employment as Messengers, Porters, &c., in Government Departments will be kept by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. For the present this list will be limited to persons who have served in the Army, and who are in receipt of a military pension.

3. Candidates belonging to this class may present themselves for examination at such times as the Commissioners may fix, at the Civil Service Commission, Cannon-row, Westminster. They must be upwards of 20 years of age, and of good health and character, and must satisfy the Commissioners of their ability to read and write.

4. Whenever the occasional service of Messengers, &c., is required by a Department, application will be made to the Civil Service Commissioners, who will select a person from the list above mentioned. The insertion of a name on this list will not, however, imply a certainty of employment; it will merely render a Candidate eligible for employment in case there should be a demand for his services.

5. The pay of persons selected for such service will be at the rate of 6d. per hour for the time during which they may be actually employed.
