The rates of postage specified in the first clause, shall be in lieu of those now chargeable, and so much of the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, as relates to letters transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and Norway, shall, on the coming into operation of this Warrant, be repealed, but so, nevertheless, as not to revive the Treasury Warrant thereby repealed.

3. This Warrant shall not prejudice or affect any exemptions or privileges granted by the Post Office Acts, nor the privilege enjoyed by seamen, soldiers, and others in Her Majesty's service, of sending and receiving letters at a reduced rate of postage.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of February, one thousand eight hun-

dred and seventy-two.
