Chelmsford Union.—Parish of Springfield.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Springfield, in the County of Essex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Springfield, in the county of Essex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons :

And whereas at a Vestry Meeting of the said parish of Springfield, held at the Vestry Room in the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Friday, the 5th day of May, 1871, it was resolved—

"That the Churchwardens and Overseers be requested to make application to the Poor Law Board for an Order for the building of a Vestry Room, under the Act 13 and 14 Vict., chap. 57."

And whereas at another meeting of the said parish, held at the Vestry Room, on Thursday, the 25th day of January last, it was resolved—

"That consent be given to the Local Government Board to issue an Order to the Churchwardens and Overseers to borrow three

"hundred and fifty pounds (£350), the sum necessary for the building of a Vestry Room, and to charge the Poor Rates of the parish with the repayment of the sum borrowed and the interest thereof, to be repaid by ten annual instalments."

And whereas application has been made in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the before-recited resolutions :

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, under the authority of the several statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct that so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish of Springfield, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish.

And we do authorize the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish to borrow a sum not exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds, and to charge the Poor Rates of the said Parish with the repayment of the sum so borrowed by equal annual instalments, not exceeding ten, together with the interest which shall from time to time accrue on the respective balances ; and we order and direct the said Churchwardens and Overseers to apply such sum, when so borrowed, to defray the cost of erecting a new Vestry Room for the said parish.

And we do hereby order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

Amlwch Highway District.

WHEREAS at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the county of Anglesey, held on the 2nd day of January, 1872, a Provisional Order was made in the words following, that is to say :—

And whereas the said Court have heard the proposal and application, and entertained the same, and have considered the premises ; now, therefore, the said Court, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Court in and by the said Act and Amended Act, do, by this Provisional Order, direct that the said parish of Amlwch alone, in the said county, shall be formed into a Highway District for the purposes of the Highway Acts, to be called the Amlwch Highway District ; it is further ordered by the said Court, that the number of waywardens which the said parish shall elect shall be three ; lastly is ordered, that the confirmation of this Provisional Order by a Final Order shall be taken into consideration by the Justices at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be held at the County-hall aforesaid, in and for the said county, on the 9th day of April now next.
