

And whereas application has been made in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the before-recited resolutions:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, under the authority of the several statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct that so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry "or other Meetings in Churches, and for regula-"ting the appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish of Springfield, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish.

And we do authorize the Churchwardens and Oveerseers of the Poor of the said Parish to borrow a sum not exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds, and to charge the Poor Rates of the said Parish with the repayment of the sum so borrowed by equal annual instalments, not exceeding ten, together with the interest which shall from time to time accrue on the respective balances; and we order and direct the said Churchwardens and Overseers to apply such sum, when so borrowed, to defray the cost of erecting a new Vestry Room for the said parish.

And we do hereby order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
