In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to

The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order and direct as follows:—

1. The several packets described or referred to in the Schedule hereto may be transmitted by the post from the United Kingdom to the countries and places mentioned and set forth in the second column of such Schedule, by the routes and means of conveyance described and set forth in the third column of such Schedule, at the rates of postage respectively specified in the same Schedule and applicable thereto, and subject to the regulations and conditions hereinafter mentioned.

2. Every packet consisting of a British newspaper transmitted by the post under the authority of this Warrant, shall be subject to the regulations and conditions now in force, and applicable to similar packets, when transmitted from the United Kingdom to Ecuador, Bolivia, Chili, or Peru, direct by British Packet Boat.

3. Every packet consisting of printed papers other than British newspapers, transmitted by the post under the authority of this Warrant, shall be subject to the regulations and conditions now in force, and applicable to similar packets when transmitted from the United Kingdom to any foreign port in South America *viâ* France, and by French Packet Boat, under certain Treasury Warrants, dated respectively the 11th day of March, 1865, the 18th day of June, 1866, and the 29th day of May, 1869.

4. Every packet consisting of patterns or samples of merchandize transmitted by the post under the authority of this Warrant, shall be subject to the regulations and conditions now in force, and applicable to similar packets when transmitted from the United Kingdom to Bavaria *viâ* France, under certain Treasury Warrants, dated respectively the 18th day of May, 1866, the 18th day of June, 1866, and the 6th day of June, 1868.

5. The rates of postage fixed by this Warrant on the several packets transmitted by the post, as herein respectively mentioned, shall be in lieu of those now chargeable thereon, and so much of a certain Treasury Warrant, dated the 6th day of December, 1869, as relates to or affects the transmission by the post of packets consisting of printed papers other than newspapers, or consisting of patterns or samples of merchandize from the United Kingdom to Ecuador, Bolivia, Chili, and Peru, *viâ* Panama by French Packet Boat, and also so much of a certain other Treasury Warrant, dated the 29th day of May, 1869, as relates to or affects the transmission by the post of packets consisting of patterns or samples of merchandize from the United Kingdom to Brazil, Mexico, Cuba, Martinique, and Guadaloupe, by French Packet Boat, shall, on the day on which this Warrant shall come into operation, be repealed.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1871.

SAINT OSYTH FAIR, ESSEX.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 25th day of March, 1872, a representation has been duly made to

me by the Justices sitting in Petty Sessions for the Division of Tendring, in the county of Essex, that a Fair has been annually held on Holy Thursday, on the Highway, in the parish of Saint Osyth, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished.

2. On the 27th day of April, 1872, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.

The Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt hereby give notice, that the sum of nineteen thousand three hundred and sixty-nine pounds twelve shillings and six pence, being one-fourth part of the said surplus of seventy-seven thousand four hundred and seven-eight pounds and ten shillings, will be applied under the provisions of the said Act, in the quarter ending the 30th day of June, 1872, towards the reduction of the National Debt.
