REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

ART. 1. The waters of the Orinoco in all the extent embraced by its mouths up to Ciudad Bolivar are open to navigation for commerce in general, and the blockade of the coasts of the said river is suspended; the Decree of the 2nd of October of 1871, which established it, being in consequence abrogated.

ART. 2. The Minister of War and Navy is charged with the fulfilment of this Decree, and to communicate it to whosoever it may be necessary.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, forwarding the subjoined extract from the "Journal Officiel," of the 5th instant to the effect that vessels coming from the British Isles will no longer be required to produce a bill of health in the Channel and Atlantic ports of France. This relaxation does not, however, apply to vessels coming from other countries which have merely touched at a port in the British Isles; viz.:—

Le Ministre de l'Agriculture et du Commerce a décidé, conformément à l'avis exprimé par le comité consultatif d'hygiène publique, que les navires provenant des Iles-Britanniques seront dispensés de produire une patente de santé à leur arrivée dans les ports Français de la Manche et de l'Océan. The Whitehaven, Cleator, and Egremont Railway (Winder Deviation).

Certificate of the Board of Trade for Construction of Deviation of part of the Railway.

WHEREAS the Whitehaven, Cleator, and Egremont Railway Company, incorporated by "The Whitehaven, Cleator, and Egremont Railway Act, 1854," as Promoters, and for the purpose of constructing a deviation of part of their railway in the county of Cumberland, have contracted for the purchase of the lands required for such deviation and the works connected therewith, and have complied with the requirements of "The Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864," and "The Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870:"

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do, by this their Certificate, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, certify as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited for all purposes as "The Whitehaven, Cleator, and Egremont Railway (Winder Deviation) Certificate, 1872."

Interpretation.

2. In this Certificate—
The expression "the Company," shall mean "The Whitehaven, Cleator, and Egremont Railway Company:"

The expression "the Railway," shall mean the new line of railway and works authorised by this Certificate:

Power to make Railway.

3. The Company may, on lands purchased by them, construct, and out of any of the moneys which they are already authorised to raise may pay for, and may maintain the railway in this Certificate after-mentioned, together with all necessary works, stations, and approaches connected therewith, in the line and according to the levels, and within the limits of deviation, shown on the plan and section deposited at the Board of Trade in respect of the railway.

Description of Railway.

4. The railway is six furlongs, or thereabouts, in length, and will be wholly situate in the township of Frizington, and parishes of Arlecdon and Lamplugh, in the county of Cumberland, and will commence by a junction with the present railway of the Company at a point thereof in the parish of Arlecdon, distant twenty-five chains, or thereabouts, from and on the south-west side of Eskett Station, and will terminate by a junction with the said railway at a point thereof in the parish of Lamplugh, distant forty-five chains, or thereabouts, from and on the north-west side of Eskett Station aforesaid.

Tolls.

5. For the purposes of guage, construction, maintenance, tolls, fares, rates, and charges, and all other purposes, the railway shall be part of the railway and undertaking of the Company as if it had been authorised by any Act of Parliament relating to the Company; and the Company may demand, recover, and receive tolls, fares, rates, and charges accordingly.

Expenses of Certificate.

6. All the costs, charges, and expenses of and incident to the preparing and procuring this Certificate shall be paid by the Company.
