## TAKELY FAIRS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows :

1. By Memorial, dated the 6th day of May, 1872, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices sitting in Petty Sessions for the Division of Dunmow, in the county of Essex, that Fairs have been annually held on the 24th day of June, in Takely-street, and on the 7th day of August, at Mole Hill Green, both in the parish of Takely, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fairs should be abolished.
