

Bodmin to Mitchell, alias St. Michael, and terminating by a junction with the same tramway at a point about 1170 yards (measured along the centre of the tramway) to the west of the said point of commencement ;  
 Railway No. 6.—A junction railway, about 4 furlongs 6 chains in length, wholly in the parish of St. Columb Minor, commencing by a junction with the existing tramway from Newquay to East Wheal Rose Mine where the said tramway crosses the parish road at Trevethick, and terminating by a junction with the aforesaid tramway from Newquay to St. Dennis, at a place called Trencreek ;

The said Railways or some of them will pass from, through, or into the parishes, townships, and extra parochial or other places following, that is to say :—Fowey, Tywardreath, St. Blazey, Luxullion, Lanlivery, St. Austell, Roche, Withiel, Newlyn, Peranzabuloe, St. Columb Major, and St. Columb Minor.

To authorise the Company to purchase and acquire by agreement, and to hold and dispose of lands and other property for the purposes of the said intended railways and works, or any of them, and also additional lands for the extraordinary purposes specified in "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and to enable the Company (subject to the conditions and restrictions contained in the Act of 1864) to break up, cross, alter, divert, or stop, permanently or temporarily, as the case may require, all roads, public highways, footpaths, railways, tramways, drains, sewers, pipes, navigations, streams, rivers, and water-courses, so far as may be necessary for the construction, maintenance, and use of the said intended railways and works, or any of them; to deviate from the lines of railway to any extent, within the limits of deviation shown on the deposited plans; to raise capital by shares and loan, and to levy tolls, rates, and charges in respect of the said intended railways and works.
