

form part of, and be included within, the said district of Saint Mark, East-street, Walworth.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The territory proposed to be annexed to the District of Saint Mark, East-street, Walworth, being :

“All that part of the district parish of Saint Peter, Walworth (within the original limits of the parish of Saint Mary, Newington), in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of London, wherein the present incumbent of such district parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which comprises the territory, containing by admeasurement two thousand six hundred square yards, or thereabouts, lying on the south-eastern side of East-street, between the streets or roads called Walworth-place and Bronti-place, respectively ; all which said part is bounded on the north-west by the district of Saint Mark, East-street, Walworth aforesaid, and on all other sides, that is to say, on the south-west, on the south-east, and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Mark, East-street, Walworth, from the district parish of Saint Peter, Walworth aforesaid, at a point in the middle of East-street aforesaid, opposite to the north-western end of the street or road called or known as Walworth-place as aforesaid ; and extending thence, south-eastward, to and along the middle of the last-named street or road, to a point at the south-eastern end of the same street or road in the wall forming the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 297, Walworth-road, and continuing thence, still generally south-eastward, along the said wall, and along the wall forming the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 301, Walworth-road, and along the wall forming the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 303, Walworth-road, to the junction of the last-described wall with the wall forming the north-western boundary of the garden attached to, and situate in rear of, the house known as No. 307, Walworth-road ; and extending thence, north-eastward, along the last-described wall, and along the wall forming the north-western boundary of the houses and premises known as Spring Cottages, to the junction of the last-described wall with the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 18, Bronti-place : and extending thence, north-westward, along the last-described wall or fence to its north-western end on the south-eastern side of the street or road, called or known as Bronti-place as aforesaid, and continuing thence, still north-westward, to a point in the middle of the last-named street or road ; and extending thence, first south-westward, and then north-westward, along the middle of the same street or road to the boundary at the junction of the said street or road with East-street aforesaid, which boundary divides the said district parish of Saint Peter, Walworth, from the district of Saint Mark, East-street, Walworth aforesaid.”

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the patron of the vicarage of

the said district parish of Saint Peter, Walworth, and of the district of Saint Mark, East-street, Walworth, and to the vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage and to the minister of the said district, and such patron, vicar, or incumbent, and minister have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four ; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine ; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five ; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, in the words and figures following ; that is to say :

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four ; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine ; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew, situate at Exwick, within the limits of the parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, in the suburbs of the city of Exeter, and in the diocese of Exeter.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew, situate at Exwick, as aforesaid.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Andrew ; situate at Exwick as aforesaid,
