The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Mr. Peter le Cocq as Vice-Consul in Guernsey for His Majesty the Emperor of Germany, King of Prussia.

The Queen has also been pleased to approve of Senor Lino Ruiz as Consul-General in London for the United States of Colombia.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess:"

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Madrid, stating that in consequence of the appearance of yellow fever at Bahia, all vessels that shall have sailed thence after the 8th of June last will be subjected to quarantine upon their arrival in Spanish ports.

VIENNA UNIVERSAL EXHIBITION, 1873.

HER Majesty's Commissioners for the Vienna Universal Exhibition have obtained from the Director-General of the Imperial Austrian Commission, Baron von Schwarz-Senborn, answers to a series of questions of importance to exhibitors in reference to various details in connection with the Exhibition, of which the following is a summary:—
