THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch and Annex which Her Majesty's Consul at Rustchuk has received from the British Acting Vice-Consul at Sulina, stating that shipmasters must present Bills of Health, that all communication with shore is prohibited, under penalty, for vessels arriving at Sulina from Roumanian ports.

THRANDESTON FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Eye, in the county of Suffolk, as owners, that a Fair has been annually held on the last day of July and first day of August, formerly in the parish of Thrandeston, but latterly within the borough of Eye, both in the county of Suffolk, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

Fog Signal at Cupe Flattery Lighthouse.

THE United States Government has given notice, that a steam fog-whistle has been established at Cape Flattery Lighthouse, on Tatouch Island, entrance of Juan de Fuca Strait. On and after the 1st day of November, 1872, during thick and foggy weather, it will be sounded at intervals of fifty-two seconds; each blast being of eight seconds' duration.
