NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 85.)—CHINA—EAST COAST.

Fixed Light at the Entrance of Wusung River.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 17,
dated 10th February, 1872, on the establishment
of a light at the entrance of Wusung River :—

The Marine Commissioners Office at Shanghai
has given notice, that the light is now exhibited.

The light is a *fixed* white light over the naviga-
ble channel at the entrance to the Wusung River
from the Yangtsze, and a *fixed red* light on each
side of the navigable channel; it is elevated 50
feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather
should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by
lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower, built of brick, is square, 45 feet
high, with a total height of 58 feet. Position,
lat. 31° 23' 22" N., long. 121° 29' 35" E.

The light when seen from the centre of the
navigable channel, bears S.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

Discontinuance of Light-junk, River Wusung.

Also, that on the 1st September, 1872, the
Light-Junk moored close to the "Lismore" wreck,
at the entrance of Wusung River, would be re-
moved.

FOOCHOW.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Middle Dog Island.

Also, that from the 12th July, 1872, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the north-east end of the Middle Dog Island, near the entrance to the Min River.

The light is a *fixed* white light, varied by a *bright flash every half minute*, visible from seaward between the bearings of E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., through south and west to N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. The light is obscured when bearing from E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., round by east to N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., by the Tongsha and Middle Dog Islands, except between the bearings of East, and E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., and of N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; and N.E. by E.; it is elevated 257 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 22 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.

The tower is round, built of stone, 35 feet high, the total height being 64 feet; the tower with dwellings and boundary wall are painted white.

(No. 86.)—NOVA SCOTIA.

Revolving Light—Entrance to Halifax Harbour.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that from the 21st August, 1872, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Chebucto Head, at the west side of the entrance to Halifax Harbour.

The light is a *revolving* white light, showing a flash *every minute*, and making a revolution *every two minutes*; it is elevated 132 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles. The purpose of the light is to guide vessels into Halifax Harbour, and to mark the dangers of Duncan Reef and Bell Rock, a little south of Chebucto Head. Position, lat. $44^{\circ} 30' 21''$ N., long. $63^{\circ} 30' 49''$ W.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

The tower is a square wooden building $22\frac{1}{2}$ feet high, and painted white.

Revolving Light at Liscomb Harbour.

Also, that from the 10th August, 1872, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the west side of Liscomb Island, 450 feet E.S.E. from Cranberry Point, and on the east side of entrance to Liscomb Harbour.

The light is a *revolving* light, showing alternate red and white flashes *every two minutes*; it is

elevated 64 feet above high water; and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles. The purpose of the light is to guide vessels into the harbour.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white; roof of dwelling painted red.

Position, lat. $44^{\circ} 59' 20''$ N., long. $61^{\circ} 57' 51''$ W.

Fixed Light at Canso Harbour.

Also, that on the 10th July, 1872, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the north-east part of Hart Island, Guysboro County.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 42 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 12 miles. The purpose of the light is to guide vessels into Canso Harbour, and through Canso, both north and south.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white.

Position, lat. $45^{\circ} 21' 0''$ N., long. $60^{\circ} 58' 31''$ W.

Fixed Light at West Arichat Harbour.

Also, that on the 10th July, 1872, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the north end of Jerseyman Island, Richmond County.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 39 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles. The purpose of the light is to guide vessels through Crid Passage, in and out of West Arichat Harbour.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white.

Position, lat. $45^{\circ} 30' 20''$ N., long. $61^{\circ} 3' 4''$ W.

Revolving Light on Chetican Island.

Also, that from the 23rd July, 1872, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at the south-west end of Chetican Island, on the north-west coast of Cape Breton.

The light is a *revolving* white light, showing a flash *every forty-five seconds*, and making a revolution *every minute and a half*. It is elevated about 149 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles. The purpose of the light is to facilitate the navigation of the coast, and to guide vessels into the harbour south of the west end Chetican Island.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

The tower is a square wooden building, 24 feet high, painted white, with a black ball seven feet in diameter on the seaward side, to distinguish it during the day from the Sea Wolf Island Lighthouse.

Position, lat. $46^{\circ} 36' 32''$ N., long. $61^{\circ} 3' 0''$ W.

Fixed Light at Sydney Harbour.

Also, that from the 17th July, 1872, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the west end of the south bar of Sydney Harbour.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated $30\frac{1}{2}$ feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles. The purpose of the light is to mark the dangers of the bar and guide vessels into the harbour.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

The tower is a square wooden building 20 feet high, painted white.

GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE.

Destruction of Lighthouse on Carousel Island.

Light Vessel off Manicouagan Shoal.

In calm weather, or with the wind, from 10 to 20 miles.

In stormy weather, or against the wind, from 3 to 8 miles.
