FRANCE.

Contracts.

ALL persons who have entered into Contracts for the delivery in France or Algeria of goods, the produce or manufacture of the United Kingdom, which Contracts remain to be executed in whole or in part before the 13th day of March, 1873, are required to give notice in writing of the said Contracts at the Foreign Office, in London, within fourteen days from the date of this notice, in order that they may be submitted to the Commission under the 21st Article of the said Treaty, with the view to ascertain the validity, date, and good faith of the said Contracts.

No notification of any Contract can be received after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of this notice.

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Consul at Charente, a Despatch, enclosing a printed extract (a copy of which is subjoined), showing the rules established with regard to the passage of vessels, bound to or from the Ports of Tonnay, Charente, and Rochefort, through the Dockyard of Rochefort. These rules came into operation on and after the 1st October.

It will be noticed that under those rules (Art. 1), the necessity, which previously applied to British ships, of being provided with "passes," and of employing Arsenal Pilots and Firemen when crossing the dockyard has been discontinued, but that the requirement to employ the last-named officers still applies to vessels stopping in the dockyard (Art. 11 and others). Also that the Sea Pilots may now conduct vessels the whole way to Charente (Art. 1). With regard to outward bound vessels the custom will be that the Pilot from the starting point, Tonnay, Charente, or Rochefort, as the case may be, will conduct the vessel to Soubise or Port des Barques, there to be relieved by the Sea Pilot. Merchant vessels are not permitted to traverse the

dockyard from gun fire in the evening to gun fire in the morning (sunset to sunrise), nor when the prohibiting signal (a white flag with a red square in centre) is hoisted. The penalty imposed by Article 15, consists of imprisonment for a period not exceeding eight days.

Dispositions à observer par les Bâtiments du Commerce, Français et Etrangers, qui traversent le Port Militaire, ou qui doivent y séjourner.

ARTICLE 1.

Les bâtiments de commerce peuvent, sans aucune formalité préalable, traverser le port militaire, du coup de canon de diane à celui de retraite, si le port n'est pas consigné. Ceux venant du bas de la Charente sont seulement tenus de s'arrêter à l'avant-garde, pour prendre le pilote de la station intérieure, s'il se présente. Si ce pilote ne se présente pas, le pilote de la station extérieure conservera la direction du bâtiment jusqu'à la Cabane-Carrée, et même jusqu'à Charente, s'il n'est pas relevé à la Cabane-Carrée.

ARTICLE 2.

Les postes-vigies de la rade et de la rivière doivent signaler exactement, à la direction du port, les bâtiments qui remontent ou qui descendent, afin que celle-ci puisse faire consigner le port militaire si des mouvements intérieurs l'exigent, ou s'il y a encombrement.

Les pilotes doivent, de leur côté, observer avec soin la tour Saint-Louis, afin que, si le port militaire est consigné, ils puissent faire mouiller à temps les navires qu'ils conduisent.

Avant de mettre les bâtiments en mouvement, pour la descente, les pilotes de la station intérieure préviennent la direction du port, soit en y venant eux-mêmes, soit par le télégraphe, s'ils résident à Charente, afin de savoir si le passage sera libre.

ARTICLE 3.

Tout bâtiment du commerce qui remonte ou qui descend la rivière doit s'assurer, avant de s'engager dans le port militaire, si le pavillon de consigne qui interdit le passage de ce port, n'est pas hissé à la mâture et à la tour Saint-Louis. Ce pavillon est blanc, avec carré rouge au milieu.

ARTICLE 4.

Les bâtiments en mouvement dans la rivière sont signalés par la tour Saint-Louis, de la manière suivante :

A la montée au moyen de 1, 2, ou 3 pavillons rouges, selon le nombre des navires, s'il s'agit de

navires à vapeur ; ou de 1, 2, ou 3 pavillons à damier rouge et blanc, selon le nombre des navires, s'il s'agit de navires à voiles.

A la descente, le pavillon de pilote est inférieur, soit au pavillon rouge, soit au pavillon damier rouge et blanc, selon que les bâtiments qui descendent sont à vapeur ou à voiles.

A la montée, les pavillons sont hissés quand les navires sont auprès du Port-des-Barques ; ils sont amenés quand les navires sont devant Soubise.

A la descente, les pavillons sont hissés quand les navires démarrent de Tonnay-Charente ; ils sont amenés quand ces mêmes navires sont devant les moulins de Fichemore.

ARTICLE 5.

Les pilotes de la station intérieure sont autorisés, en tout temps, à monter à la tour Saint-Louis, pour s'assurer du point précis où se trouvent les bâtiments dont ils ont à prendre la direction à la montée.

Ils peuvent réclamer, s'il est nécessaire, l'assistance des bâtiments ou des pontons, et faire des observations si le passage libre de la rivière leur paraissait trop engagé.

ARTICLE 6.

Les bâtiments à vapeur et les bâtiments à voiles ayant le vent favorable, doivent toujours franchir le port militaire à contre-courant.

Les bâtiments à voiles qui se laissent dériver doivent se tenir, l'avant au courant, avec un bout de chaîne traînant sur le fond et avec des amarres.

Les bâtiments à vapeur destinés pour le bassin du commerce sont exceptionnellement autorisés à traverser le port militaire avec la fin du flot, dans ce cas, ils sont obligés d'avoir à l'arrière une ancre à jet en mouillage, avec un grelin. Une bouée doit être frappée sur ce grelin.

Si une circonstance imprévue forçait le bâtiment à laisser tomber cette ancre à jet, afin d'éviter, soit des avaries contre un des navires du port, soit un échouage, ce grelin serait filé par le bout, lorsque le bâtiment pourrait continuer sa route. L'ancre et le grelin seraient relevés ensuite, par les soins de la direction du port et remis à leur propriétaire.

ARTICLE 7.

Il est interdit aux bâtiments du commerce français ou étrangers de séjourner dans le port militaire, s'ils n'y sont appelés pour prendre ou débarquer un chargement. Ceux qui, surpris par une circonstance fortuite, seront forcés de s'arrêter, s'amarreront le long d'un des pontons ; la tour Saint-Louis préviendra la direction du port de l'arrêt du bâtiment dans l'arsenal. Le gardien du ponton sur lequel se sera amarré le navire, veillera à ce que personne de l'équipage ne communique avec la terre, jusqu'à l'arrivée de l'agent de surveillance de la direction des mouvements du port.

ARTICLE 8.

Il est interdit à tout bâtiment de commerce traversant le port militaire de s'y arrêter, s'il n'y est contraint par une circonstance de force majeure, et de communiquer, par quelque moyen que ce soit, avec les bâtiments ou les embarcations du port.

Les gardiens, gendarmes et autres agents de service aux postes de l'avant-garde, de l'arrière-garde et du raz, doivent veiller à l'observation de cette consigne.

En cas de contravention, les gardiens, gendarmes ou agents de ces trois postes se préviendront mutuellement, au moyen d'un pavillon bleu à croix blanche. Le bâtiment qui aura contrevenu serait,

le cas échéant, sommé de s'arrêter à sa sortie de l'arsenal, pour que des investigations soient faites à bord. Si le bâtiment refusait d'obtempérer à la sommation qui lui aurait été faite, l'autorité prendrait des mesures pour que les investigations aient lieu, suivant le cas, soit en rade de l'île d'Aix, soit au poste d'amarrage du navire.

ARTICLE 9.

Il n'est permis à aucun bâtiment, à aucune embarcation du commerce, de passer par le port militaire, après le coup de canon de retraite et avant le coup de canon de Diane.

ARTICLE 10.

Aucune embarcation de commerce appartenant, soit à un navire mouillé en dehors des limites de l'arsenal, soit à des particuliers, ne peut entrer dans le port militaire, sans une autorisation spéciale du major-général.

Les embarcations qui obtiendront cette autorisation seront visitées à l'entrée et à la sortie, par les gardiens des postes-flottants.

ARTICLE 11.

Les bâtiments du commerce qui séjournent dans le port militaire, pour y prendre ou pour y débarquer un chargement, ainsi que ceux qui, ne faisant que traverser, sont obligés de s'amarrer pour y attendre le retour de la marée ou pour tout autre motif, ne peuvent démarquer qu'après avoir été visités par un portier désigné par le gardien-major, un maître de la direction du port et un gendarme pris à la porte du Soleil.

Si le bâtiment est à vapeur, la direction des mouvements du port enverra à son bord un pompier pour s'assurer que les feux sont éteints.

Dans le cas où un bâtiment à vapeur, forcé de s'arrêter le long d'un ponton dans le port militaire désirerait conserver les feux au fond des fourneaux, il sera tenu de recevoir à son bord un pompier pour la surveillance de ces feux.

La rémunération due au pompier, pour ce service extraordinaire, est fixée à la somme de 0 fr. 33 c. par heure de présence à bord. Les fractions d'heures inférieures à une demi-heure, seront payées 0 fr. 20 c. et celles au dessus d'une demi-heure, comme l'heure entière.

ARTICLE 12.

Lorsqu'un bâtiment de commerce, chargé pour l'Etat, devra entrer dans le port militaire, ou qu'il devra être amarré en dehors, il recevra, aussitôt que sa présence sera signalée, un maître de la direction du port, pour le conduire et le faire amarrer au poste désigné par le directeur du port.

ARTICLE 13.

Lorsqu'un bâtiment du commerce chargé pour l'Etat est amarré en dehors du port militaire, il reçoit de la direction du port un agent qui a mission de veiller au travail de chargement et de déchargement.

Les embarcations de ce bâtiment ne sont admises dans le port militaire que pour le service ; elles sont tenues de se faire visiter à leur arrivée et à leur sortie, par les agents du gardiennage.

ARTICLE 14.

Les équipages des bâtiments du commerce, français et étrangers séjournant dans le port militaire pour un motif quelconque, ne doivent, sous aucun prétexte, s'éloigner, pendant le jour, du poste où leurs bâtiments sont amarrés, si ce n'est pour se rendre directement en ville.

Il leur est interdit de quitter leur bâtiment pendant la nuit.

ARTICLE 15.

Toute contravention aux dispositions qui précèdent, sera passible de la répression édictée par l'avant dernier paragraphe de l'Article 8 du décret du 21 Juin, 1858, sur la police et la discipline les ports et arsenaux.

Alteration in Lights at Naples.

THE Italian Government has given notice, that from the 17th day of October, 1872, the following alterations would be made in the lights at Naples.

The fixed and flashing light on St. Vincent Mole would be moved to the extremity of the mole, and *flashes* shown every *thirty seconds* instead of every minute, and the temporary fixed red light at the extremity of the mole would be discontinued.

The green light at the extremity of St. Gennaro Mole, of the Mercantile Port, would be obscured in the direction of St. Vincent Mole, terminating at the extremity of the new foundation of the mole, in order that the light may be visible to vessels passing the mole.

ADRIATIC.

Harbour Light at Cotrone.

Also, that a white light, suspended from an iron bracket fixed on a house, is now exhibited at the extremity of the Great Mole at Cotrone. The light is elevated 23 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 2 miles.

Fixed Red Light on Daxa Rock, Gravosa.

Also, that from the 13th October, 1872, a light would be exhibited on the north end of Daxa, entrance of Port Gravosa.

The light is a *fixed red* light elevated 51 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 5 miles.

The light would be exhibited from a pole near the keeper's dwelling. Position, lat. 42° 40' N., long. 18° 3' E.
