## Fixed Red Light at Coruña.

THE Spanish Government has given notice that a harbour light is now exhibited from the extremity of the embarkation mole at Coruña.

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 23 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be

seen from a distance of 6 miles.

The lighthouse is a wooden octagonal building with an iron column in the centre which supports the apparatus. From it, San Antonio Castle bears S.E. by E. and San Diego Castle, S. ½ W. Position, lat. 43° 22′ N., long. 8° 23′ W.
