The QUEENS's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868,' sections three and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham.

"Whereas the said Chapter now consists of a Dean and six Canons, six Canonries having been suspended under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the Fourth Report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues.'

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter have agreed with us that a scheme should be laid before your Majesty in Council, for carrying into effect a transfer to us of part of the property belonging to them, for the considerations and upon the terms hereinafter set forth, which terms are in our opinion fair and reasonable; and the said Dean and Chapter have further agreed with us that such scheme should also comprise the incidental provisions hereinafter set forth, such provisions being necessary for carrying into effect the said transfer.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments, which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked A, are part of the property of the said Dean and Chapter, and the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked B are vested in us in fee simple in possession, subject to the payment to the said Dean and Chapter of certain reserved or chief rents in respect of portions thereof, and to the right of the said Dean and Chapter to the minerals in and under, and to way-leaves for their own minerals over portions thereof, and we are also in possession of the lands and hereditaments comprised in the second part of the

said schedule marked A, having acquired by purchase certain leasehold interests therein.

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the second day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and duly published in the London Gazette of the sixth day of the same month, and made under the authority of the hereinbefore-mentioned Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, and of another Act of the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' provision is made for securing to the Dean and Canons of the said cathedral church, appointed subsequently to the passing of the said Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, the respective annual income of three thousand pounds for such Dean and one thousand pounds for every such Canon, it being by the said Order provided that the surplus of the same decanal and canonical incomes respectively, calculated in the manner therein specified, shall be paid over to us, or that any deficiency in the amount of such incomes respectively shall be made up by means of payments out of our funds.

"And whereas the Reverend Henry Jenkyns, Doctor in Divinity, one of the Canons of the said cathedral church, was appointed to such canonry before the passing of the said Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, and is accordingly now receiving, under the provisions of the said Order, the whole share of capitular income arising in respect of his said canonry, and he or his representatives will be entitled to receive such share up to the twenty-ninth day of September next following the avoidance of the said canonry; and we are satisfied, after due inquiry, that the share of capitular revenue which the said Henry Jenkyns is thus entitled to receive may be fairly estimated as exceeding on the average the annual income to which the future holder of his canonry will be entitled by the amount of two thousand pounds per annum.

"And whereas, after due inquiry, we have satisfied ourselves that the income arising from the lands and hereditaments hereinafter proposed to be reserved or transferred to the said Dean and Chapter, and from the several annual payments proposed to be made to them by us, will suffice, after the appropriation of a certain part of such income, in the manner hereinafter recommended, to the maintenance of the fabric, establishment, and services of the said church, to provide for the present and future Dean and Canons the

incomes to which they are respectively entitled under the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Acts and Order in Council, and we are of opinion that the arrangement hereinafter set forth will be the most convenient mode of effecting for the future the purposes contemplated in the hereinbefore mentioned Order of your Majesty in Council.

"Now, therefore, with the consent, in writing, of the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Durham, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Lord Bishop of Durham, as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter (testified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals), we humbly recommend and propose, that all the property of the said Dean and Chapter, excepting the cathedral church and the precincts thereof (commonly called the College Precincts), and all houses, buildings, lands, tenements and hereditaments heretofore known or accepted as parcel of the said precincts, and all rights, privileges, ways, easements, and advantages thereto belonging, or with the same or any part thereof held or enjoyed, or reputed as part thereof, or appertaining thereto, and excepting any ecclesiastical, educational, or other like patronage, and any property held by the said Dean and Chapter in trust for special or charitable purposes, and also excepting the lands and other property described in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A, but not including in this exception any mines, quarries, beds of coal, stone, clay, sand, metalliferous substances, or minerals of any description, in and under the lands to be so excepted in the said schedule marked A, otherwise than as is therein specified, shall, together with the benefit of the perpetual land-tax charged thereupon, which has been redeemed, be, upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be duly published in the London Gazette, transferred to us in the manner contemplated by the said first-mentioned Act, and that we shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said property, as from the twenty-ninth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer to us as aforesaid, all our estate and interest in the lands and hereditaments particularly set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed marked B (but saving and reserving thereout to us and our successors all and singular the mines, quarries, and beds of coal, stone, clay, sand, metalliferous substances, and minerals of all descriptions, under the said lands, and the rights of working such minerals, as hereinafter set forth), and also all our estate and interest in the lands, tenements, and hereditaments particularly set forth in the second part of the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A, shall, upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be duly published in the London Gazette, be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter in the manner contemplated by the said first-mentioned Act, and that the said Dean and Chapter shall be entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds thereof, as from the said twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy; and that, in further consideration of and for such transfer, we shall surrender all right and be excluded from all participation (in respect of the said suspended canonries or otherwise) to and in the proceeds of the estates and property to be retained by the said Dean and Chapter, or to be hereby or hereafter transferred to them as part of their permanent endowment, or in the money payments hereinafter mentioned; and that, in

further consideration of and for such transfer to us as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter, by equal half-yearly payments, on the twenty-fifth day of March and the twenty-ninth day of September in every year, the annual sum of eleven thousand pounds, and that such payment shall continue until the said Dean and Chapter shall have been, under the authority provided by the said first-mentioned Act, put in possession in fee simple of real estates sufficient to secure to them a clear annual income, irrespective of the income arising from the estates intended to be hereby reserved or transferred to them, and after allowing for rates, taxes, agency, and other outgoings of eleven thousand pounds.

"And we further recommend and propose, that we and our successors, and our and their lessees, tenants, and assigns, shall at all times hereafter have full and exclusive authority to enter upon all or any part of the lands and hereditaments specified in the schedules to this scheme, and shall be entitled to take, use, and occupy, from time to time, and for such time and in such manner as we or they shall think fit, so much of the same lands and hereditaments as we or they shall deem necessary, proper, or convenient for the purpose of working all and singular the mines and quarries to which we shall be entitled in or under the said lands and hereditaments, or of sinking and working new mines and quarries in or under the said lands and hereditaments, or of working, winning, getting up, and carrying away the beds of coal, stone, clay, sand, metalliferous substances, and minerals of all descriptions, to which we shall be entitled in or under the said lands and hereditaments, or for the purpose of working, winning, getting up, or of carrying away the beds of coal, stone, clay, sand, metalliferous substances, and minerals of all descriptions, in or under any other lands and hereditaments whatsoever, whether belonging or to belong to ourselves or to any other body corporate or person whomsoever, according to the course and practice at present or hereafter to be used or adopted in the county of Durham, or according to the most improved mode which may from time to time be used or invented, making full compensation for any injury thereby occasioned, and that we and our successors, and our and their lessees, tenants, and assigns, and persons acting under our or their authority, shall be entitled to make, grant, and use for the purpose of working, winning, getting up, or of carrying away the beds of coal, stone, clay, sand, metalliferous substances and minerals of all descriptions in or under the lands and hereditaments comprised in the said schedules; and in or under any other lands and hereditaments whatsoever, whether belonging, or to belong to ourselves, or to any other body corporate or person whomsoever, any way or ways upon, across, under, or through the lands and hereditaments comprised in the same schedules; provided always that it shall not be lawful for us, or our successors, or our or their lessees, tenants, or assigns to sink or make any fresh pits upon any land now, or heretofore, belonging to the said Dean and Chapter or to the Warden, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Durham, situate within a distance of two miles, measured in a straight line, from any part of the precincts of the said cathedral church, except with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter, to be given in writing under their corporate seal; provided always, and we hereby further recommend and propose, that the said Dean and Chapter shall have full power and liberty of taking and using so much of the clay, sand, gravel, limestone, and freestone in or under the lands

hereby proposed to be retained by, or to be transferred to, the said Dean and Chapter, as they shall require for erecting, making, and repairing farm-houses and buildings, roads and ways on the same lands, or for fencing, draining, and manuring the same lands, or for any other purpose of agriculture and husbandry, such clay, sand, gravel, limestone, and freestone to be expended by the said Dean and Chapter on the said lands hereby proposed to be transferred to them, or to be retained by them.

"And we further recommend and propose that in further consideration of and for such transfer, there shall be paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter, by equal half-yearly payments, on the twenty-fifth day of March, and the twenty-ninth day of September in every year, until the twenty-ninth day of September next following the avoidance of the canonry held by the said Henry Jenkyns, the sum of two thousand pounds annually, which sum of two thousand pounds shall be paid over by the said Dean and Chapter to the said Henry Jenkyns or his representatives.

"And we further recommend and propose that there shall also be paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter, by equal half-yearly payments, on the twenty-fifth day of March and the twenty-ninth day of September in every year, during the life of Edward Peele, Gentleman, their present Chapter Clerk, the annual sum of seven hundred pounds, and that there shall also be paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter, by similar half-yearly payments in every year, during the life of Edward Fenwick Boyd, their present Mineral Agent, the annual sum of six hundred pounds (which said last-mentioned annual sums shall be appropriated and paid by the said Dean and Chapter to the said Edward Peele and Edward Fenwick Boyd respectively, in respect of the profits which would have accrued to them on account of the management of the estates hereby proposed to be transferred to us), and that the first half-yearly payment in respect of each of the annual sums hereinbefore proposed to be paid to the said Dean and Chapter for the period which elapsed between the said twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the twenty-fifth day of March last, shall be made immediately on the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and that the receipt or receipts of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Dean and Chapter shall be a good and valid discharge to us for all, or any, and every such sum or sums of money as shall therein be expressed to have been paid to him by us under the authority of this scheme when ratified as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that, as a further consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid, there shall be set apart by us immediately upon the publication of such Order as aforesaid, a capital sum of ten thousand pounds, to be expended by the said Dean and Chapter in the restoration of the farm buildings upon the estates proposed to be reserved, and on those proposed to be transferred to them by this scheme, and that interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum shall be allowed and paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter as from the said twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, upon the said capital sum of ten thousand pounds, and upon the balances thereof from time to time remaining in our hands.

"And we further recommend and propose that as a further consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid there shall be set apart by us, immediately upon the publication of such Order as aforesaid,

a capital sum of twenty thousand pounds, to be expended by the said Dean and Chapter in the execution of drainage works upon the lands proposed to be reserved to and upon those proposed to be transferred to them by this scheme, and in paying off a certain charge to which part of the lands comprised in the said schedule marked A are subject, in respect of a loan made to the said Dean and Chapter for the purpose of draining such lands under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session held in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-one, and that interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum shall be allowed and paid by us to the said Dean and Chapter as from the said twenty-ninth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy, upon the said sum of twenty thousand pounds, and upon the balances thereof from time to time remaining in our hands.

"And we further recommend and propose that, as a further consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid, a capital sum of twenty thousand pounds shall be set apart by us to be expended by the said Dean and Chapter to our satisfaction in substantial repairs, restoration, and improvements of the said cathedral church and of the buildings belonging thereto, and that interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum shall be allowed by us to the said Dean and Chapter as from the said twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, upon the said capital sum of twenty thousand pounds, and on the balances thereof from time to time remaining in our hands, such interest to be also expended to our satisfaction in substantial repairs, restoration, and improvements of the said cathedral church and buildings.

"And we further recommend and propose that until the said Dean and Chapter shall have been put in possession, in the manner hereinbefore mentioned, of real estates calculated to produce the sum of eleven thousand pounds per annum, the total annual income derived by them from all sources, excepting the three several annual sums hereinbefore proposed to be paid by us for the benefit of the said Henry Jenkyns, Edward Peele, and Edward Fenwick Boyd respectively, shall be appropriated in the following manner, namely, the sum of nine thousand pounds per annum shall be applied to providing the incomes of the Dean and Canons, that is to say the income of three thousand pounds for the Dean and one thousand pounds for each Canon, and the sum of three thousand pounds per annum shall be appropriated to providing for the expenses of the school belonging to the said cathedral church, and for the repairs of the buildings in connection with or belonging to the said school, and that the remainder of such total annual income shall be appropriated to the maintenance of the services of the said church, the repairs of the fabric thereof, and of the buildings belonging thereto, and to the payment of all the other expenses and liabilities chargeable upon the corporate revenues of the said Dean and Chapter, and that if the whole of the respective sums so to be appropriated to the support of the said school, and to the maintenance of the services of the said church, and to other purposes as aforesaid be not in any one year expended on the objects to which they are severally and respectively applicable, the surplus so remaining in every such case shall be accumulated and applied to the same respective objects in a subsequent year or subsequent years, and that when and as soon as the said Dean and Chapter shall have been placed in possession as aforesaid of real estates calculated

to produce the annual sum of eleven thousand pounds, the net income derived by them from such estates, and from the estates hereby proposed to be reserved to and to be transferred to them, including any interest paid to them by us in respect of the monies proposed to be set apart by us as aforesaid for the purposes of repairs and drainage on the said estates shall, after payment of all outgoings and charges on such income, be annually divided by them into twenty-six parts, which twenty-six parts shall be appropriated in perpetuity as follows, that is to say, three of such parts for the income of the Dean, six of such parts for the income of the six Canons, three of such parts for the maintenance of the said school, and the repairs of the said school buildings, and the remaining fourteen of such parts shall be applied to defraying the expenses of maintaining the services of the said church, the repairs of the fabric thereof, and of the buildings

belonging thereto, and all the other expenses and liabilities chargeable upon the corporate revenues of the Dean and Chapter: Provided always, that if the whole of the three parts to be appropriated to the maintenance of the school, or of the fourteen parts to be appropriated to the maintenance of the fabric and services, and other purposes respectively as aforesaid, be not in any one year expended on the objects to which they are respectively applicable, the surplus remaining in every such case shall be accumulated and applied to the same respective objects in a subsequent year or subsequent years.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, in conformity with the said Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
