THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid inclosing the following Order of the Ministry of the Interior respecting Quarantine:—

Extract from Madrid Gazette of 2nd December, 1872:—

"In view of the questions asked of this Ministry by various provincial health authorities as to the means of deciding the primitive starting point of ships, for the effects of Articles 30 and 37 of the Law, and other orders of the department, the King has ordered the fulfilment of the following rules:—

1. "As a general rule, for sanitary purposes, by primitive starting point is meant the place from which a vessel sails with cargo or ballast after having finished her voyage there.
2. "Vessels proceeding from a foul or suspected port or whose bills of health, not originally clean,

become, from any circumstance, foul, shall, although they may effect unloading operations or conclude their voyage in other intermediate clean ports, preserve in principle the said compromised ports as their starting point, and their bills of health shall continue to be foul, until they perform abroad or in Spain the quarantine ordered by our Laws.

3. "The 'Direccion-General de Beneficencia Sanidad, y Establecimientos Penales,' is authorised to interpret and apply the foregoing rule as to cases similar to each other and as to special cases not applying rigorous quarantine, imposing precautionary measures, or admitting vessels to free pratique in view of their circumstances, and of the interests of public health and maritime commerce.

4. "The orders of the Direction of the Department of 27th April, 1868, 31st August, 11th and 23rd September, 1871, and 16th instant, and any other order on this subject are abrogated."

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration.*

I. The Examination, which will be held at the Cape, will be in the following subjects; viz. :—

1. Handwriting and Orthography.
2. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, and Extraction of the Square Root).
3. Art of Logarithms.
4. Algebra, as far as simple Equations.
5. Trigonometry, as applied to the Solution and Computation of Plane Triangles.
6. The use of the Globes.
7. Names and positions of the Principal Stars.
8. Proportions and dimensions of the Orbits of the Planets, and their periodic times.
9. The appearance and phases of the Moon and Planets, and the cause of the phases.

II. A fee of £1 will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination.

III. No Candidate will be eligible whose age on the first day of the Examination is less than 18 or more than 25.
