AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of December, 1872.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

2. Animals becoming affected with foot-and-mouth disease while being conveyed by railway within the Borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, or while in any lair within that Borough, or while being carried, led, or driven on a highway or thoroughfare within that Borough, may, notwithstanding anything in any Order or regulation made under the Act of 1869, be moved to the slaughter-house provided for that purpose, and situated near the New Cattle Market, in Marlborough-street, within the Borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in manner, and under the conditions following, and not otherwise:—

- (1.) The animals shall be moved with a Licence of the inspector of the Local Authority of the Borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, specially appointed to issue such Licences.
- (2.) The Animals shall be moved in properly constructed cattle-vans from the railway, or from the lair, highway, or thoroughfare aforesaid, by the nearest route to the slaughter-house aforesaid, and shall there be slaughtered within forty-eight hours after their arrival there.
- (3.) The cattle-vans shall be specially appropriated for the purpose of conveying such animals, and shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of their being so appropriated, and shall have a red stripe two feet wide all round to distinguish them as so appropriated; and shall, after each occasion of use, be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided by Article seventeen of The Animals Order of 1871.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, enclosing the following Order of the Ministry of the Interior further respecting Quarantine:—

Extract from the Madrid Gazette, December 2, 1872:—

MINISTRY OF THE INTERIOR.

"In accordance with what is laid down in the Royal Order of to-day's date with respect to the primitive starting point of ships for the application of health measures, I have considered it expedient to determine that any ship hailing from a foul port, or one that is suspected (notoriously compromised, Article 36 of the Law, and Rule 12 of the Royal Order of June 6 of 1860) or that may have been admitted to pratique in other intermediate ports of a like nature, and which may afterwards unload (such discharge being complete) in a clean port, without performing the quarantine required by our laws, and which, not having communicated subsequently with any place, either suspected or foul, shall set sail with a fresh clean cargo, or in ballast, bound for our ports, should arrive with a clean bill of health, in a satisfactory hygienic condition and no suspicious accident on board, will have to undergo three days of observation, with ventilation and fumigation.

"The same treatment shall be given to any ship which, leaving the ports either foul or suspected referred to in ballast, may load clean goods in a clean port, and, without having any further communication with compromised ports, may come to Spain, arriving in the state above-mentioned."
