

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Adlington, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of two hundred and seventeen pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and to be receivable, in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November, in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

All that the modus or customary annual payment of two pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, arising in the parish of Saint Mary, Seavington, in the county of Somerset, which was formerly payable to the prebendary of Ashill, in the cathedral church of Wells aforesaid.
