

## The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Wiltshire, holden at Salisbury.  
In the Matter of George Isaac Galpin, of Downton, in the county of Wilts, Innkeeper, a Bankrupt.

Alfred Cotton Harper, of No. 2, Cowper's-court, Cornhill, in the city of London, has been appointed Trustee of the property of the bankrupt.
