THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order, bearing date the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, relating to sheep and goats brought to Great Britain from any place in the Empire of Germany, and landed in Great Britain: Provided that nothing herein shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

VIENNA UNIVERSAL EXHIBITION OF 1873.

Notice to British Exhibitors.—Protection of Industrial Designs and Inventions.

A SPECIAL LAW for the Protection of Objects exhibited at the Universal Exhibition in Vienna in 1873, sanctioned by His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, and dated 13th November, 1872, has been promulgated and published in the official "Wiener Zeitung" of the 28th November, 1872, No. 273, and in the "Imperial Law Gazette" of the same date, LVIII, No. 159. Her Majesty's Commissioners have caused the following translation of the law to be prepared for the information of Exhibitors in the British Section.

With the concurrence of the two Houses of the Reichsrath I hereby decree as follows:—

ART. I.

Exhibitors can obtain a "Certificate of Protection" by applying to the Director General.

Application must be made previous to the opening of the Exhibition, or, if later, before the installation of the objects in the Exhibition.

It must be accompanied by an exact description of the exhibits, and double copies of plans or drawings, or two specimens of the Trade Mark, Design, or Model in separate cases.

If application be made through an agent, letter of authorisation must be added likewise.

Every Austrian and every Foreigner who exhibits in the Universal Exhibition of 1873 at Vienna, any object or objects which, according to the provisions of the Law of August 15, 1852 (Imperial Law Gazette, No. 184), and the two Laws of December 7, 1858 (I. L. G., Nos. 230 and 237), are qualified to be granted a Patent or protection as to security of Trade Mark or Design, can obtain for the same from the Director-General of the Universal Exhibition a "Certificate of Protection" (Schutz-Certificat). An application to that effect must be addressed to the Director-General at the latest previous to the date of the opening of the Exhibition, or should the goods arrive later, prior to their installation in the Exhibition, and they must be accompanied by an exact description of the same, and (so far as is required for explanation) by double copies of plans or drawings, or two specimens of the Trade Mark, Design or Model, as the case may be, enclosed in two separate cases or envelopes. If the application be made through an agent or other authorised person, the letter of authorisation must be added likewise.

ART. II.

"Certificate of Protection" is granted gratis, and is valid till 31st December, 1873.

Exhibitors can apply for a regular Patent, or protection of Trade Mark or Design, before the 31st December, 1873.

The "Certificate of Protection" will be issued free of expense, by the Director-General of the Universal Exhibition, and be countersigned by an official appointed for that purpose by the Hungarian Ministry, and will secure to the applicant, from the date stated therein of the admission of the respective objects into the

Exhibition—or if the application should have been made after that date, from the day of making the application—until the 31st December, 1873, inclusive, the same rights and privileges which a Patent, obtained in the regular course, or a duly obtained Registration for the protection of a Trade Mark, Design, or Model, would grant him. The Exhibitor is reserved the right to apply to the appointed authorities, before the day of expiration of the "Certificate of Protection," for a Patent, or the protection of the Trade Mark or Design, for the same object or objects, according to the provisions of the laws mentioned in Art. I.

ART. III.

No appeal is allowed against the Director-General's decision.

No appeal or complaint will be admitted against the decision of the Director-General respecting the granting or refusal of such "Certificate of Protection."

In case the validity of any of the "Certificates of Protection" should be disputed, the competent authorities will have to decide the question according to the existing Patent Laws.

ART. IV.

Double Registers of Applications and Certificates issued will be kept.

A double Register will be kept by the Director-General of the Universal Exhibition of the applications for "Certificates of Protection" and of the Certificates issued, of which, after the close of the Exhibition, one with the aforesaid applications and a copy of the specifications attached to them, as also of the Trade Marks, Designs, and Models, will be lodged with the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce; and the other, with copies of the application and other appendices, with the Royal Hungarian Ministry for Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce.

ART. V.

Certificates of Protection will be published in the Austrian and Hungarian Official Gazettes. The Registers will be open for inspection to every one. Secrecy will be observed, if desired.

The "Certificates of Protection" issued will be published in the Austrian and Hungarian Official Gazettes. The inspection of the Register of "Certificates of Protection" is open to every one, but the specifications, plans, models, &c., will be kept secret, if it be so desired in the application.

ART. VI.

The Minister of Commerce is charged with the execution of this Law.

(No. 120.)—MEDITERRANEAN—SPAIN.

Harbour Light at Barcelona.

THE Spanish Government has given notice, that a *red* light is now exhibited 33 feet above the sea, on the extremity of the western mole at Barcelona. It should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 3 miles.

NOTE.—The extremity of the east mole is still marked by a red light. Vessels may enter the port between the lights, and pass at a distance of 40 yards from the western light, and 60 yards from the eastern light.

ITALY—WEST COAST.

Harbour Lights at Viareggio.

The Italian Government has given notice, that a *fixed red* light is now exhibited from the extremity of the southern mole at Viareggio, and that the colour of the light on the northern mole has been changed from red to *green*.

Fixed and Flashing Light near Heisternest.

The light is a *fixed and flashing* light, showing a *white* light for *thirty seconds*, followed by an eclipse of *ten seconds*, then a *red flash* of *ten seconds*, and another eclipse of *ten seconds*; it is elevated 120 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.

Dangers off Loberia and Huily Heads.

INFORMATION has been received of the following sunken dangers off Loberia and Huily Heads, east side of the entrance of Conception Bay, viz.:—

Off *Loberia Head*.—A pinnacle rock (*Lozzi Rock*) with about 10 feet on it at low water, and 20 to 22 fathoms around; it lies W.S.W., nearly half a mile from the south point of Loberia Head; the sea was observed to break over it in bad weather, but under ordinary conditions of swell it is not discernible, and therefore dangerous.

Off *Huily Head*.—A detached rock (*Zealous Rock*) nearly a-wash at low water, with 4 fathoms between it and the shore, and 5 fathoms at a distance of 2 cables outside. This danger lies S. by W., 4 cables from Huily Head, and W. ¼ S. one mile from the south point of Morro del Tome. A buoy is to be placed on this danger.

NOTE.—On account of these sunken dangers vessels should keep at least a mile from the shore when navigating between Loberia Head and Morro del Tome.

Also, that there is now no perch on the Choros Bank. The Belen Bank Buoy has been removed

from the south extreme of the shoal to the centre, and is now moored in two fathoms.

(No. 123.)—NORTH ATLANTIC—BERMUDA ISLANDS.

Coral Heads in Channel of Narrows.

INFORMATION has been received that H.M. Ship *Ariadne* touched on a shoal patch of coral rock between the Fairway and inner chequered buoy of the channel of the Narrows, Bermuda.

The patch, at the time of the ship touching had 22 feet water on it, but it has been deepened by blasting to 24 feet at low water. From the shoal the Fairway buoy bears N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., 4 cables; inner chequered buoy, E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables; and the west extreme of Catherine Point, S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., 7 cables.

As the shoal ground renders this part of the channel very intricate for vessels of heavy draught, and as it is possible that more heads of a similar nature may exist, caution is necessary.

Intermittent Light on Olinda Point.

THE Brazilian Government has given Notice that a light is now exhibited from the old fort of Montenegro, on Olinda Point.

The light is an *intermittent* white light, which in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

NOTE.—The Picao (Recife) Light, which is 3 miles S.E. by S. from Olinda Point, is a revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, but showing twice white and once red, with eclipses of five seconds. This alternation of colour distinguishes it from the Olinda Light. Olinda Point should not be approached within 3 miles, to be clear of the Olinda Shoals.

(No. 1.)—NEW ZEALAND—MIDDLE ISLAND.

(1.) *Sunken Danger off N.W. Coast.*

INFORMATION has been received from Captain Stewart, of the schooner *Dunedin*, of the existence of a sunken danger lying eight miles from the shore off the north-west coast of the Middle Island of New Zealand, and nearly mid-distance between Cape Farewell and Rocks Point.

This danger (*Stewart Breakers*) was observed shortly after a gale from the S.W. had ceased, and was then breaking heavily: the following bearings were taken near the breakers:—Cape Farewell high-land N.E. by E., Rocks Point, South, and the remarkable White Landslip north of Kiourangi Point S.S.E.; from this position the breakers extended S.W. about $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles, and places the danger approximately in lat. $40^{\circ} 39' S.$, and long $172^{\circ} 13' E.$

It is also reported that the master of the schooner E. N. Cameron, in searching for the danger, obtained a cast of eight fathoms near the position assigned.

NORTH ISLAND.

(2.) *Fixed Light at Wanganui River.*

Information has been received through a German Government Notice, that a *fixed* white light is exhibited from the flagstaff on the Castle Cliff (North Head of Wanganui River, it is elevated 65 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 13 miles.

Sunken Rock near Chinchu Harbour.

INFORMATION has been received of the existence of a sunken rock, on which H.M. Ship *Juno* struck, when standing for an anchorage in Tongbu Bay, between Chinchu Harbour and Port Matheson.

The rock (*Juno Rock*) appeared to be a cluster of coral heads, with 12 feet at low water and 6 fathoms around. From the rock, the west corner of Tongbu Wall bears N.E. $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles, the summit of the islet in the bay N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles, Tahkut Island Fort W. $\frac{1}{3}$ N. $3\frac{1}{10}$ miles, and east point of Passage Island W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. nearly 4 miles. These bearings place the danger in lat. $24^{\circ} 51' N.$, long. $118^{\circ} 53' E.$
