

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Northumberland, holden at Newcastle.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against James Main, of Phillipson's-buildings, Neville-street, in the borough and county of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Attorney and Solicitor.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the act or acts of the Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said James Main having been given, it is ordered that the said James Main be, and he is hereby adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 4th day of February, 1873.
