NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 14.)—AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST—QUEENSLAND.

(1.) *Alteration in Wide Bay Bar.*

THE Colonial Government of Queensland has given notice, that the leading beacons on Inskip and Hook Points now lead over the bar of Wide Bay, southern entrance to Great Sandy Strait, on a S.W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. bearing, with 3 fathoms at low water. Small vessels can pass through a middle channel which has recently opened out, with 10 feet at low water, by keeping Baupal Mountain just open of the high land on Great Sandy Island. A pilot service is to be established at Hook Point, and strangers are recommended not to attempt to enter Great Sandy Strait by the Wide Bay entrance without a pilot.
